Counseling and Student Support

- Lead advisory and guidance lessons focused on social-emotional learning (SEL) topics, such as resilience, self-advocacy, and emotional regulation.
- Conduct small group sessions on relevant topics, including peer relationships, stress management, and academic motivation.



- Monitor students' well-being through proactive communication and regular check-ins, offering timely support and crisis intervention as needs arise.
- Support the SST by contributing to the development, implementation, and evaluation of Individual Learning Plans (ILPs) for students requiring additional support.

Behavior Management and Social Skills

- Collaborate with teachers to implement behavior support strategies that enhance students' social interactions and help them manage their behavior effectively.
- Facilitate social skills training, employing a restorative approach to encourage positive conflict resolution, self-regulation, and respect for others.
- Support students with behavioral or emotional challenges, collaborating closely with the SST to develop behavior plans that encourage self-awareness and responsible decision-making.

Academic Advising and Scheduling

- Oversee the scheduling process, making adjustments as necessary to support each student's academic progress and social-emotional well-being.
- Assist with student transitions between grade levels, providing tailored support to help students manage new academic and social expectations.
- Guide students in selecting courses aligned with their academic goals, personal interests, and graduation requirements.
- Work closely with MS leadership, teachers, SST members, and administrative staff to ensure accurate course placement and address conflicts as they arise.

Transition and Community Engagement

- Coordinate programs that support students' transitions between elementary and middle school, and middle to high school, promoting a smooth adjustment to new expectations.
- Organize orientation sessions for new students and families, ensuring a welcoming and supportive start at JIS.
- Develop and facilitate parent workshops on topics relevant to adolescent development, SEL, and positive parenting.
- Maintain relationships with local and regional agencies, referring students and families to external resources as needed.

Child Safeguarding and Ethical Practices

- Act as a child safeguarding officer, promoting and adhering to the school's child safeguarding policies and practices.
- Support families navigating complex situations, offering guidance while ensuring adherence to safeguarding standards in all interactions.
