SCHOOL CLOSING PROCEDURES

There may be days when the school must close or open late due to weather. This decision is usually made before 5:30 a.m. Information about closings and delays will be posted on our website at www.southcountry.org, and a telephone announcement will be distributed over the district's pre-recorded system. In addition, all school closings or delays will be announced on local television and radio stations: WALK 97.5 FM, WBAB 102.3 FM, WBZO 103.2 FM, WRCN 103.9 FM, WBLI 106.1 FM, and Channel 12 TV News.

The South Country Central School District is pleased to make it possible for parents of Bellport Middle School students to access academic progress and attendance in each class via the Internet. We believe this access will improve parent and teacher communication as well as student responsibility. Through this portal, parents will be able to view schedules, progress reports, report cards, attendance, and grade books.

In order for access to be granted, you must first register for a parent account. After district personnel are able to authenticate the registration information, an e-mail will be sent to you confirming that your account has been activated. A single password and login allows parental access. Each parent/guardian may establish an account (please allow a minimum of 72 hours for approval). Click on the links below for instructions and access to Parent Portal.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

When filling out the application, PLEASE DO NOT ABBREVIATE, USE LOWERCASE LETTERS, OR USE NICKNAMES. The registration will be rejected if you use “Joey” instead of “Joseph”, “Al” instead of “Allison”, etc. If both parents wish to register, they must fill out two separate applications. Please do not register as “John & Mary Jones”. Use ONE name. When entering the mailing address of where the student resides, please enter it as printed on a report card, progress report, or schedule.

Common Errors or Problems:

1. DENIED an account, the primary reason is that the information you provided does not match our school data. This is for security purposes. Please do not call the school to have the e-mail added. You must print out the letter found on our website under Parent Portal and return it to your child’s school.
2. If you cannot access the Parent Portal, please e-mail parentportal@southcountry.org and someone will answer your inquiries promptly. Please include your name, address, description of the problem, student name(s), and a phone number where we can reach you.

Student Portal

In an effort to provide additional support to students in monitoring their academic standing, Bellport Middle School provides students access to **eSchool Student Portal**. ATTENDANCE INFORMATION

1. Students must provide a note of absence to their homeroom teacher upon returning to school.
2. All notes must include the date(s) and reason(s) for absence.
3. Three or more consecutive absences require a doctor's note. Please note, requests for homework can be made by calling 730-1631. It is important that you call as early as possible so the work can be gathered for your child.

To qualify for "EXCUSED absent" status, students must furnish appropriate written documentation upon their return to school.

Unexcused

Absences not mentioned above are interpreted under the law as "unexcused absences" including but not limited to vacation, babysitting, over-sleeping, needed at home, cold weather or missing the bus and extended family vacations. Any reason not listed as excused shall be deemed unexcused.

Automated Absence Calls

If your child is absent or is late to school and misses homeroom in the morning, you may receive phone call notification through the district's automated call system. If you have signed your child in at the door or you provided a note for the lateness or absence, this will be documented in your child's attendance accordingly. Please note, you *may* receive an automated call even if you have signed your child in. This will be corrected by the end of the business day.

NOTE: Truancy is defined as illegally absent without parent consent. Excessive absences will be reviewed and dealt with on a case by case basis.

Late to School

Students must sign in at the desk in the BELLPORT MIDDLE SCHOOL lobby and must provide a note explaining the lateness. A student's reasons for lateness will be assessed excused or unexcused as per definitions. In cases of five or more unexcused latenesses, the parent/guardians will be notified.

ParentSquare:

We are excited to announce the addition of ParentSquare, a unified communication platform to allow district, school administrators and teachers to more effectively communicate and engage with faculty, staff, families and students. Parents will receive an activation email for their ParentSquare account. Those who do not register will still receive text, email, and phone notifications. Parents who create an account can interact by viewing photos, downloading attachments, leaving comments, messaging teachers, and managing their communication settings and preferences, including 2-way language translation. The district will provide a variety of resources for parents.

Student Use of Personal Electronic Devices:

[Policy 5695 - Students and Personal Electronic Devices](#)

- No student use of internet-enabled devices (e.g., cell phones, smartwatches, tablets) is permitted during the school day on school grounds including in class, during lunch, recess, and hallway transitions, unless a documented exception applies.
- Middle and High School students are strongly encouraged to leave all internet-enabled devices at home. If a student in grades 6-12 needs to bring internet-enabled devices to school, those devices must be stored in the student's school-issued locker for the duration of the school day.
- Exceptions, with administrative approval and appropriate documentation, may be granted for students with medical needs, students with family care responsibilities, and students in grades four and five who walk home unsupervised.
- In case of emergency, communication between parents and students must go through the school's main office.

Devices used without approval will be held in the main office until the end of the day, with escalating consequences for repeated violations.

GENERAL POLICIES

Backpacks, String Bags and Handbags

Students are permitted to carry backpacks, string bags and handbags to class during the school day.

Bicycles

Students may ride their bicycles to school. They are to be kept locked in the bike racks which are located at the front of the building off Kreamer Street. The school district assumes no responsibility for the security of bicycles.

Bullying

What is Bullying?

- Using words or actions to hurt someone else
- Gossiping about others
- Putting down others
- Leaving others out--- telling others not to be friends with someone.
- Using the Internet and/or social networks to threaten, tease, and/or humiliate

students

Signs your child may be a victim of bullying?

- Becomes quiet and withdrawn
- Changes route to school
- Comes home with cuts, bruises or torn clothing
- “Loses” clothing or possessions
- Ravenous when they get home
- Avoids leaving the house
- Does not want to take the bus to school
- Suggests changing schools or moving

What to do you when your child is being bullied?

- Create an open line of communication with your child.
- Be proactive. Discuss a plan of action with your child on steps to take if they should ever become a victim of bullying.
- Report incident to school authorities, i.e. teachers, guidance counselors, social workers, school psychologist, Assistant Principal, or Principal. Adults in the school environment need to be made aware of the extent of the bullying, where and when it happens. **As a school, we cannot fix what we do not know about.**

Bystander Responsibility

Student onlookers need to understand that they are responsible for their actions when they witness a bullying incident. In particular, bystanders should know they will face negative consequences if they decide to join a bully in taunting or teasing a victim, cheer the bully on, laugh at the bullying incident, or otherwise take part in the bullying.

Bus Ridership

Please check the bus schedule carefully and review this information with your child. It is important that your child knows the bus number he/she will be taking to and from school. Only students who have been designated as bus riders may ride the bus. Students will only be picked-up and/or dropped off from their assigned bus stops.

Any student that wants to ride another bus must receive administrative authorization in advance by submitting a parent’s note to the grade level Assistant Principal’s office for approval DURING HOMEROOM.

The note must contain the following information:

Students’ first and last name.

First and last name of the student they are riding home with.

The number of the bus the student wishes to ride and address of the stop.

Date with Parent/guardian Signature.

Safety:

Wherever possible, a certified trainer or EMT is assigned for games, particularly for sports that involve heavy physical contact. In addition, every coach is required to maintain current certification in First Aid and CPR. All teams are provided with first aid equipment and supplies.

Eligibility

The South Country Central School District’s Eligibility Policy can be accessed on our school website.

Students ***must be in school for at least 5 periods*** in order to participate in any practice or game on that day.

Late Buses

Late buses are available on Monday - Friday to take the students home from school. The late buses will not drop the students off at their “normal” a.m. or p.m. stop, but at bus stops determined by transportation. Teachers and administrators are available after school to assist students in locating the correct late bus to board.

Bellport Middle School maintains a lost and found closet. Students can check for missing items during the morning arrival or during their respective lunch periods. Items not claimed will be discarded every two weeks.

Visitors

The building principal or his or her designee is responsible for all persons in the building and on the grounds. For these reasons, the following rules apply to visitors to the schools.

Anyone who is not a regular staff member or student of the school will be considered a visitor.

All visitors to the school must report to the security desk and/or main office upon arrival at the school. There they will be required to sign the visitor’s register and will be issued a visitor’s identification badge, which must be worn at all times while in the school or on school grounds. The visitor must return the identification badge to the main office and/or security desk before leaving the building.

Visitors attending school functions that are open to the public, such as Parent-Teacher Association meetings or public gatherings, are not required to register,

Fall Sports

All students who wish to try out for the Fall Season (football, soccer or cross-country) must have physical examinations completed by the beginning of school in order to participate on one of these teams. Please refer to the letters from the Director of Athletics, Health and Physical Education and the nurse's packet for more details. *Fall sports meetings occur during the first week of school and announced to students during morning announcements. Our daily announcements are on the Bellport Middle School website each day.

Permission Slips

Student-Athletes will not be allowed to practice or play in games until the coach has received an official permission slip signed by a parent. Slips are distributed by the coach, or may be picked up in the Athletic Office.

Pre-season Meetings

It is customary for most coaches to hold pre-season information and sign-up meetings in advance of their seasons. For the fall, these meetings are held in the late spring and for the winter and spring seasons, toward the end of the season preceding. Details on these meetings are announced over the public address system and are publicized by signs posted around the building.

Practices

Practices are held Monday through Friday afternoons, usually from 3:00 PM to 5:00 PM, with adjustments possible when inclement weather disrupts outdoor activities. Most teams also practice on Saturdays, generally in the morning. Under no circumstances are teams permitted to practice/play on seven (7) consecutive days. Practices are also held during such vacation periods as Thanksgiving, Christmas, and winter and spring breaks.

Practices may be scheduled at the coach's discretion, contingent on the availability of athletes. Coaches are always asked to provide parents with printed practice (and game) schedules to facilitate drop-off and pick-up times, and to coordinate with other family commitments. Game schedules are on the Section XI website www.sectionxi.org. There are buses at 5:15 PM to transport athletes home from practice sessions. Since games run later than 5:15 pm, parents must arrange for pick-up of athletes on game days and on Saturdays.

Holy Day Observance: On the following days, neither games nor scrimmages may be scheduled:

1 st Day of Passover - April 2	Holy Thursday - April 2

Passes are issued during students' lunch period and not at the end of the day. Phone permissions are not allowed.

Remember that riding on a school bus is a privilege, not a right. The same rules and regulations are outlined in the District's Code of Conduct also apply on all school buses. Students not conforming to the rules will be obliged to supply their own transportation.

If you are questioning a change in bus stop or pick-up time, please contact Towne Bus LLC directly at 631-345-9600. For all other safety concerns regarding your child riding the bus, please contact the school at 631-730-1642.

Cafeteria Services

Students will be assigned to either the East or the West cafeteria. Any request for a change of cafeteria will be assessed and decided based on the special circumstance.

All students enrolled in the district, regardless of income level, are eligible to receive a healthy school breakfast and lunch at no charge each day. No further action is required of families. Students will be able to participate in these meal programs without having to pay a fee or submit a meal application!

Code of Conduct

The South Country Central School District is committed to ensuring that our schools are safe, secure and orderly environments in which teaching and learning take place each day. A safe and supportive school depends upon the efforts of all members of the school community—teachers, students, administrators, parents, guidance counselors, school psychologists, social workers, safety personnel, related service providers, cafeteria, custodial and bus staff—to treat one another with mutual respect. The Code of Conduct promotes responsible student behavior and an atmosphere of dignity and respect by establishing guidelines to help students as they strive to become productive citizens in a diverse society. Schoolwide Expectations

At Bellport Middle School, all students, staff, and visitors are expected to demonstrate SAFE, RESPECTFUL, and RESPONSIBLE behaviors at all times. To emphasize this expectation, all students will be introduced to the

specific behaviors that should be demonstrated in all common areas of the building through grade level assemblies and smaller class meetings. As of 2018—2019 a new vaccination, Meningococcal is required for all 7th graders.

Athletic Physicals

Any 7th or 8th grader who intends to compete on an interscholastic athletic team must have a sports physical examination (one per year). New York State regulations require that all student athletes must have a sports physical in order to participate in interscholastic athletics. Sports physicals are in effect for one year from the date that the physical was administered.

You have the option of having the physical given by your family Physician or our school doctor. Anyone receiving a physical exam for athletics must use the Bellport Athletic Physical form. You may get a copy from the South Country website. Click on “Athletics” and then download school physical forms.

Parents must fill in, and sign the Health History section of the physical form and bring both the Health Certificate/Appraisal form and Physical form to the exam.

All completed and signed forms must be returned to the nurse’s office or to your coach. If you choose to have your physical performed by the school physician a completed and signed physical form must be brought to the nurse’s office at the time of your scheduled school sports physical.

Please note that all sports physicals must have final approval from the school physician. Sport Physicals are administrated in June and January. For any questions or concerns, please contact the Health Office at (631) 730-1633.

Interscholastic Athletic Program

The Middle School Interscholastic Athletic Program is ONLY available to 7th and 8th graders in good academic and behavioral standing. Our 6th graders may participate in intramural programs.

- developing discipline and skills necessary for personal success and well being
- promoting the image and identity of the school and community

Students who choose to participate in activities will conduct themselves appropriately at all times both on school grounds and away from the school.

The responsibility of good conduct is an extension of the responsibility to represent the school and community in an appropriate manner.

Dress Code

All students are expected to give proper attention to personal cleanliness and to dress appropriately for school and school functions. Students and their parent(s)/guardian(s) have the primary responsibility for acceptable student dress and appearance. Teachers and all other district personnel should exemplify and reinforce acceptable student dress and help students develop an understanding of appropriate appearance in the school setting.

The following standards of dress, grooming and appearance, including hair style/color, jewelry, make-up and nails will be observed in all South Country School District schools:

1. All dress, grooming and appearance must be safe, appropriate, non-disruptive, non-threatening and must not interfere with the educational process.
2. Recognize that extremely brief garments are inappropriate and unacceptable. This may include but is not limited to the following: tank tops, backless tops, single shoulder tops, tube tops, skirts/skorts above mid-thigh length, slippers and pajamas, etc.
3. Underwear must be completely covered with outer clothing at all times.
4. Pants must be worn at the waist.
5. Shirts must be no longer than fingertip length.
6. If worn, belts or overalls straps must be buckled.
7. Footwear must be worn at all times and must be appropriate for school activities.

Students found to be dressed inappropriately will be first directed to the Guidance Department to select from the clothing supply available on premises in an effort to avoid any further disciplinary action.

Any who refuses to modify his/her dress shall be subject to disciplinary measures up to and including suspension for the day. Any student who repeatedly fails to comply with the dress code shall be subject to further disciplinary measures, up to and including out-of-school suspension.

Drop Off/Pick-Up

Student drop off in the morning and student pick up in the afternoon occurs in the **East Lot, located on South Street**, off Station Road, one block north of Kreamer Street. Students who are dropped off in this area will be able to enter the building no earlier than 7:30 and will be supervised in the East Cafeteria.

ACADEMIC RECOGNITION PROGRAMS

Honor Rolls

In order to make the Honor Roll, a student must achieve an 85.0% - 89.99%, High Honor Roll 90.0% - 100%. Students who achieves Honor Roll status will be recognized by receiving an Honor Roll Certificate and have his or her name displayed on the bulletin board outside the main office.

National Junior Honor Society

The National Junior Honor Society is an academic and community service based organization open to 6th and 7th grade students who meet the academic and community service requirements. Eligible students will be invited to join the National Junior Honor Society at the end of the third quarter of their 6th, 7th or 8th grade school year.

In order to be invited into the Honor Society, students must meet the following criteria:

Maintain an 88 academic average per quarter (the average of the 5 major academic areas – Math, English, Social Studies, Science, and Foreign Language) or an 85 academic average per quarter if student is in **BOTH** honors classes (Math and Science) in each of the first three quarters of the school year.

****NOTE:** If a student enrolled in either honors class for the first quarter and subsequently transfers into a non-honors class at the end of the first quarter, through the remainder of the school year, that student must meet an 88 academic average for the remaining quarters.

- Maintain an 88 average in special area classes (Art, Physical Education, Technology, Home and Careers, Music, Health, etc.)
- Have **NO** grades less than a 70 in **ANY** class in **ANY** quarter.
- Have no behavior issues and/or suspensions.
- Participate in at least **THREE** (3) extracurricular activities (Sports Teams, Religion Classes, Band/Orchestra/Chorus, etc.)
- Receive **THREE** (3) teacher recommendations.

Students meeting all the criteria will be inducted into Honor Society at a ceremony in November.

Homework

The Bellport Middle School takes pride on providing high quality instruction. Therefore, homework is a tool used as an opportunity for students and parents to review the material reviewed in class. As a result, the frequency in which homework is assigned will be up to the description of the classroom teacher.

Extra Help

Extra help is available to every student during 10th period from 2:40 pm – 3:10 pm. Teachers publish their extra help schedules on line and in the building. However, if a student is having difficulty attending extra help on the days published, he/she should discuss this with his/her teacher so that other arrangements can be made. Please be informed that Extra Help may become a requirement for those students failing two or more assessments in a quarter.

School Counselors and Support Staff

At Bellport Middle School, we have three (3) school counselors, one (1) Student Support Counselor, three (3) social workers, and two (2) psychologists. They offer many valuable resources within both the school and the community. Our school counselors provide information and personal counseling regarding academic requirements and goals, social and developmental needs and instruction in career exploration appropriate for each grade level.

The primary function of our social worker is to intervene in situations where behavioral and social barriers interfere with a student's ability to attain his/her educational potential. Among many of the services they provide, our social workers oversee our peer mediation program. They also work with students, teachers, parents, school administrators, and the community to address issues of student behavior, student attendance, family issues, school issues and access to community support services.

Our school psychologist is a specialist in child development, learning, motivational and social-emotional functioning. This knowledge will be applied when counseling, consulting with children, parents, and school personnel. In addition, the school psychologist helps parents and teachers with special education referrals and procedures.

Health Services

The Nurse's office is mandated by state law to maintain accurate health records on every student. New York State mandates that physical exams are required for children entering grades K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 & 11. If we do not receive your child's exam by October 30th, we will have your child seen by our school doctor. Please call the school nurse if you do not wish your child to have an
