

VOLLEYBALLERS SMACK SOUTH GIBSON; CROSSNOE 5TH AT THE FARMS' KICKOFF CLASSIC

Obviously not slowed by the weariness of playing five matches over the weekend at the Spartan Tournament in Memphis, Crockett County's volleyball team traveled over to Medina Monday evening and spanked South Gibson County 3-0 in fairly lopsided sets.

In high school golf action, Lady Cavalier junior Rachel Crossnoe exchanged her cheerleading pom poms for her golf bag and placed fifth in the Kickoff Classic 18-hole tournament at The Farms in Dyersburg, carding a 95 to reach the top five of a large event for the second straight time.

Crockett's soccer match with Jackson Central-Merry Monday was canceled when the visitors sent word that they were unable to secure transportation for the afternoon contest. The match will not be rescheduled.

VOLLEYBALL: Coach Andrew Laman's Lady Cavs pounded the host Lady Hornets in three straight sets that weren't close. Crockett won 25-13, 25-12, and 25-14 to improve its season record to 7-2.

Laman's club won three of five matches in Memphis over the weekend, in contests that were all two-set sweeps. The Lady Cavs dropped their opener to Brighton and then defeated Tipton-Rosemark, Memphis East, and Millington before falling in their finale to Lawrence County.

Crockett is back again Tuesday evening, hosting Gibson County.

GOLF: Crockett teams competed in the Kickoff Classic in Dyersburg, and both the girls and boys squads finished in the middle of their respective packs of schools.

Crossnoe, who was third in the recent FCA Tournament in Humboldt, tied for fifth in Dyersburg with Madison Academic's Nora Manley.

With Crossnoe's 95 paired with Alyssa Stricklin's 121, the Lady Cavs placed seventh out of 14 girls teams. TCA phenom Tori Robinson, who won the FCA event, again was the girls medalist at The Farms with a 71.

Crockett's boys team finished eighth out of the 20 schools with entries, led by Jack Shaver's 76, good for a tie for tenth in the individual standings. Others contributing to the Cavalier scoring were George Randall (87), Max Woods (88), and Will Harber (97).

Thursday the golfers will face Jackson South Side at Woodland Hills.
