### Attendance Policy

Being present in school is essential for academic progress. The objective of the district’s attendance policy is to promote student attendance and respond to unexcused absences, incidents of tardiness and early departures. Communication about district expectations is important to our school-home partnership. The following types of absences, incidents of tardiness or early departures are considered excused: personal illness, serious illness or death in the family, religious observance, quarantine, court appearances, and other specific circumstances noted in our Board Policy 7006.

The following types of absences, incidents of tardiness or early departures are considered unexcused: vacationing, shopping, babysitting, oversleeping or missing the bus.

Please note, on days school is in session, a student-athlete must report to school no later than 12:30 p.m. on the day of an athletic game or extracurricular event in order to participate. If the student-athlete is present for at least two hours before 12:30 p.m., and then is legally excused, the student may participate in the school activity.

### New York State Report Cards

### Health & Wellness and Safety Notifications

#### Health Information Privacy

Health care records maintained by schools are considered education records and are subject to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) rules, and not the privacy portions of HIPAA. The disclosure requirements of health care providers from offices whose agencies are governed by HIPAA must be followed by the district in order to gain access to health care information. To allow sharing of HIPAA information, the parent may provide the information directly to the school or may complete an authorization form.



## School Climate Topics

### Code of Conduct

The Code of Conduct is able to be reviewed in full as Poland CSD Board Policy #1005.

(Plain Language Summary for Grades PK-5)

The district's Code of Conduct aims to ensure a safe and orderly learning environment for all students by fostering respect and responsibility. Students have the right to learn in a harassment-free and fair environment, to participate in school activities, and to understand school rules, with the opportunity to explain their perspective if issues arise. Responsibilities include actively contributing to a positive school atmosphere, treating everyone with kindness and respect, attending school prepared, and refraining from disruptive or disrespectful conduct. It's crucial for students to report any concerns about weapons, harmful substances, or threats. Prohibited actions include any behavior that disrupts learning, violates school rules, or involves violence, harassment, or unauthorized use of electronic devices or school property.

(Plain Language Summary for Grades 6-12)

The district's Code of Conduct establishes expectations for a safe and productive learning environment for all

students. Students have the right to a respectful and harassment-free educational experience, fair treatment, and access to school activities. Students have the right to understand school rules and present their perspective if facing disciplinary action. Students are responsible for contributing to a positive school atmosphere by using respectful language, attending regularly and punctually, actively participating in their education, and following directions from all school staff.

Prohibited conduct includes, but is not limited to, disruptive behavior in class or school activities, using inappropriate language, violating the dress code, lying, theft, vandalism, trespassing, harassment, bullying, discrimination, violent conduct - such as physical assault or threats, possession of weapons, alcohol, or illegal substances. It's crucial for students to report any concerns about weapons, illegal substances, or threats. Academic dishonesty, including cheating or plagiarism, is strictly forbidden. Disciplinary actions for violations can range from verbal warnings to suspension or expulsion, depending on the severity and frequency of the offense.

### Dignity for All Students Act

All students should have a safe, supportive education environment that is free from discrimination, intimidation, taunting, harassment and bullying. Schools have anti-harassment and discrimination policies, school training programs, and instruction in civility, citizenship and character education for every grade level. ### Non-Discrimination/Equal Opportunity

The district does not discriminate on the basis of race (defined as, but not limited to, ancestry, color, ethnic group identification, and ethnic background, as well as traits historically associated with race including hair texture and protective hairstyles), color, national origin, creed, disability, sex, sexual orientation, marital status, age, military status or any other protected status in its educational programs, employment or any other activities. Employers may not retaliate against any individual because that person filed

## Student Data

### Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

Parents and students who are 18 years of age or older (known as “eligible students”) have certain rights with respect to the student’s education records.

Parents/guardians and eligible students have the right to:

- Review records within 45 days after the request for access is received by Laura Dutton, 315- 826-0203;
- Request amendment of the education records that the parent/guardian or eligible student believes are inaccurate, misleading or otherwise in violation of the student’s privacy rights;
- Provide written consent before the school discloses personally identifiable information from the student’s education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent;
- File a complaint with the USDOE concerning alleged failures by the district to comply with requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the office that administers FERPA are: Family Policy Compliance Office, U.S. Department of Education, 400 Maryland Avenue SW, Washington, DC 20202.

### Military Recruiters’ & Institutes of Higher Education’s Access to Student Information

Pursuant to federal law, the district must provide military recruiters and institutions of higher education, upon request, the names, addresses and telephone numbers of high school students. Parents or eligible students aged 18 or older who do not want this information released to military recruiters and/or institutes of higher education should contact the district guidance director at 315-826-0200, ext. 3.

## Student Safeguards

### Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment

Parents/guardians have certain rights regarding the conduct of surveys, collection and use of information



for marketing purposes and certain physical exams. A survey funded in whole or part by the U.S. Department of Education, must include parent consent before students are required to complete a survey that asks about any of the following protected areas:

- Political affiliations or beliefs of the student or student’s parents/guardians;
- Mental or psychological problems of the student or student’s family;
- Sexual behavior or attitudes;
- Illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating or demeaning behavior;
- Critical appraisals of others with whom respondents have close family relationships;
- Legally recognized privileged relationships, such as with lawyers, doctors or ministers;
- Religious practices, affiliations or beliefs of the student or student’s parent/guardian; or
- Income, other than as required by law to determine program eligibility.

Parents/guardians will also receive a notice and an opportunity to opt students out of the following:

- Any other survey that asks about the above protected areas;

- Any non-emergency, invasive physical exam or screening required as a condition of attending school or school functions, with the exception of physical exams or screenings required or permitted by state law (e.g. hearing, vision or scoliosis); and
- Activities involving collection, disclosure or use of personal information collected from students for marketing or to sell or otherwise distribute the information to others.

Parents/guardians have the right to inspect any surveys that ask about the above protected areas, as well as surveys created by third parties that are used to collect personal information from students for marketing purposes and instructional materials used as part of the curriculum.

The school district will directly notify parents/guardians of its student privacy policy at the start of each school year and after any substantive changes. Parents/guardians will also be provided with reasonable notification of specific activities or surveys covered by this policy and the ability to opt their child out of such activities.

These rights transfer from the parents/guardians to their child who is at least 18 years old or an emancipated minor.

Anyone who believes their rights have been violated may file a complaint with: Family Policy Compliance Office, U.S. Department of Education, 400 Maryland Avenue, SW, Washington, D.C. 20202.



### Release of Student Directory Information

Consistent with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), the district has designated certain categories of personally identifiable student information that it may release without prior written consent. This is known as “directory information.” The purpose of doing this is to share activities and student accomplishments to be publicized and for the creation of such publications as the annual yearbook, programs for graduations, concerts and other special events, sports activity sheets and honor roll or recognition lists. Achievements are typically published on the school website and through school district social media and official district publications. Directory information can also be disclosed to outside organizations without prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but are not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings or publish yearbooks.

To restrict information pertaining to your child, please send a written request to Laura Dutton, School Records Officer, by Oct. 15.

The district is not responsible for media news, sporting events or other such school events that are open to the public, such as plays, competitions and performances.

### Participation in Graduation Ceremonies by All Eligible Students

All eligible students are allowed to participate in a high school graduation ceremony and associated graduation activities with their graduating class (i.e., the 12th-grade class with which such student entered into ninth grade). The district’s guidance director, Janice Watrous (jwatrous@polandcsd.org), is the point of contact for questions about participation in graduation and other secondary programs available to students.

### Title I Funding

Parents have a right to know and request the professional qualifications of their child’s teachers because the district receives Title 1 funding. The notification requirements include:

- Whether a teacher has state certification for the grade levels and subjects he or she is teaching;
- Whether a teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or licensing criteria have been waived;
- Whether the teacher is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification of the teacher;

- Whether their child receives services from paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications; and
- Whether their child has been taught for four or more weeks in a row by a teacher “who does not meet applicable state certification or licensure requirements at the grade level and subject area in which the teacher has been assigned.”

Parents may request the qualifications of their child’s teachers by contacting the district office, 315-826-0203. Additional district information about Title 1 and the Right to Know is on the website under the “District Plans and Notices”.

### Grade Promotion and Placement

Parents, teachers, staff members, and principals are all essential to guiding decisions about grade level promotion and placement. The final discretion rests with the school administration. A variety of indicators of achievement and growth is used to make the determination. The district Policy 8100, available on our website, more fully explains the process.





## Facilities Notifications

### Asbestos Management

The district maintains asbestos management plans for buildings. The plans are on file in the Business Office and are available for review during normal business hours. Periodic surveys are conducted every six months. Currently, the district has no projects scheduled that will disturb asbestos-containing building material.

### Integrated Pest Management

Schools provide written notification to parents/guardians and staff members regarding the potential use of pesticides throughout the school year. The district maintains a list of all individuals who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide

applications. To receive 48-hour notifications of pesticide applications that are scheduled to occur, please call 315-826-0203. When an emergency application is necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the notification list. Some pesticide applications are not subject to notification requirements, including anti-microbial products, EPA-designated biopesticides and exempt materials, and when a school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application.

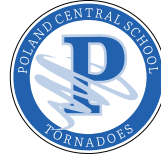
