

FFE - EXTRACURRICULAR PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

Philosophy

The Board believes that participation in extracurricular activities constitutes a privilege and not a right. Students who participate in extracurricular activities represent the student body, school district, and community on the state and national level. As such, these students' behavior is a reflection on the entire community.

The District shall enforce the requirements placed on extracurricular participants by North Dakota law and the North Dakota High School Activities Association (NDHSAA), which govern both on- and off-campus behavior. In addition, the Board has established the following extracurricular participation requirements.

Activities Affected by this Policy

Activities affected by this policy shall include extracurricular activities as listed in the student handbook, including those not sponsored by NDHSAA.

The Board may prohibit a student from participating in any extracurricular activity if:

1. The Student has pled guilty to or been convicted of a criminal offense and sentenced under NDCC 12.1-32-02.1 or been convicted of an offense specified in subsection 1 of NDCC 12.1-32-09.1;
2. The student has:
 - a. An order prohibiting contact issued against the student at the request of another student or employee of the District;
 - b. A disorderly conduct restraining order issued against the student at the request of another student or employee of the District, except a temporary restraining order;
 - c. A protection order issued against the student at the request of another student or employee of the District, except a temporary protection order; or
 - d. Any other order issued against the student prohibiting contact with a student or employee of the District which is signed by a district judge or a judicial referee within a delinquency or criminal case;
 - e. The Principal receives information pertaining to an offense or order as provided in NDCC 27-20.2-21; or
 - f. The victim of the offense or the subject of the order notifies the Principal of the offense or order.

A representative of the juvenile court system may notify the Principal regarding the existence of files or records of the juvenile court pertaining to a student which are open to inspection by the Principal under North Dakota Law.

Academics

For the purposes of this policy, a failing grade is defined as receiving a grade or lower in any curricular course as computed from the beginning of the semester for regular education students or, in the case of special education students, not meeting the goals of Individual Education Programs as assessed from the beginning of the semester.

Violation of Other Misconduct Policies

Students who violate student conduct policies not covered by NDHSAA bylaws may be subject to suspension from extracurricular activities for a period of six consecutive weeks for the first offense and a period of eighteen weeks for any subsequent offense(s). Such consequences shall be imposed in addition to other disciplinary consequences imposed under the applicable policy.

REQUIRED

Suspension Procedure

When the building principal or Administrator, because of their investigation, concludes that a violation of this policy or NDHSAA bylaws has occurred, they shall issue notice to the student of this suspension.

Practice and Travel while Suspended

Students who are under suspension are encouraged to practice and travel with their respective teams. However, suspended students will not be allowed to miss school time to travel with the team.
