## SCHOOL CHARACTERISTICS

Kingswood Regional High School (KRHS), founded in 1964, is a comprehensive four-year high school located in Wolfeboro, New Hampshire. It serves the towns of Brookfield, Effingham, New Durham, Ossipee, Tuftonboro, Wolfeboro, and Middleton. With an enrollment of **749** students, Kingswood offers a wide variety of academic and elective courses to encourage students to explore diverse avenues of learning. This includes a strong college preparatory curriculum, Honors, Advanced Placement, as well as technical coursework at the adjacent Lakes Region Technology Center. Kingswood is accredited by the NH Department of Education and the New England Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools & Colleges.

Kingswood Regional High School uses Infinite Campus SIS and SCOIR.

## COMMUNITY CHARACTERISTICS

Kingswood Reg HS is located in the Lakes Region of New Hampshire, where the primary employment is based on seasonal tourism, retail, health care, or education. Our community is rural, and a good majority of the population is seasonal, as this is a second home destination for families and retirees. Community colleges are within an hour's driving distance (one way) for most of our students. There is no reliable public transportation in our communities. Our community heavily supports education through positive budgets, teacher contracts, as well as through significant commitments to scholarships, athletics, and the arts.

## LAKES REGION TECHNOLOGY CENTER (LRTC)

The Lakes Region Technology Center offers programs in Agricultural Science, Automotive Service Tech., Careers in Education, Collision Tech, Computer Network Systems, Construction Trades, Culinary Arts/Hospitality, Graphic Design, Health Science Technology, Marine Technology, Marketing Ed, Multimedia Communications, Nurse Assisting, Precision Manufacturing, and Theater Stagecraft.

## CURRICULUM INFORMATION

Kingswood follows a traditional semester schedule: two 18-week semesters. KRHS has used a modified 4X4 block schedule since 1996. Classes are scheduled either by quarters, semesters, or yearlong. Students are required to take a minimum of seven credits per year. A full range of courses are offered to students from career/technical to advanced placement. Most coursework is offered at different weighted levels. Please see our school's Program of Studies (found on our website), for additional information.

Advanced Placement courses are open to any student based on performance. There is no limit on the number of AP/Honors classes a student may take, however, scheduling may impact accommodation in some instances.

For the Class of 2026:

AP Courses Offered 2025/2026: AP Biology, AP Calculus, AP English Language and Composition, AP Spanish, AP Studio Art (AP Portfolio I & II), AP World History.

Early College Credits Offered 2025/2026: Through partnerships with the *NH Community College System*, Early College credits allow students to gain college credit. Courses offered this year:

Statistics, Accounting I, Health Science, Licensed Nurse Asst, Medical Terminology, Principles of Marketing, Machine Processes, Spanish, French, Chemistry, Human Anatomy & Physiology, Foundations of Early Childhood Education, Intro to Auto Service, Sanitation & Safety, and Precision Manufacturing.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

All students are required to earn 26 credits for graduation. These credits include: 4 English, 3 Math, 3 Science, 1 US History, 1 World History, 1 American Gov't/Economics, 1 Additional Math Content Elective Course taken Gr 12\*, 1/2 cr. Social Studies, 1/2 Arts Education, 1/2 Computer Education, 1/2 Health & Wellness, and 1 Physical Education.

\*4<sup>th</sup> math credit must be taken during 12<sup>th</sup> grade year and options included math courses as well as approved math content courses. See the Program of Studies for approved courses.
