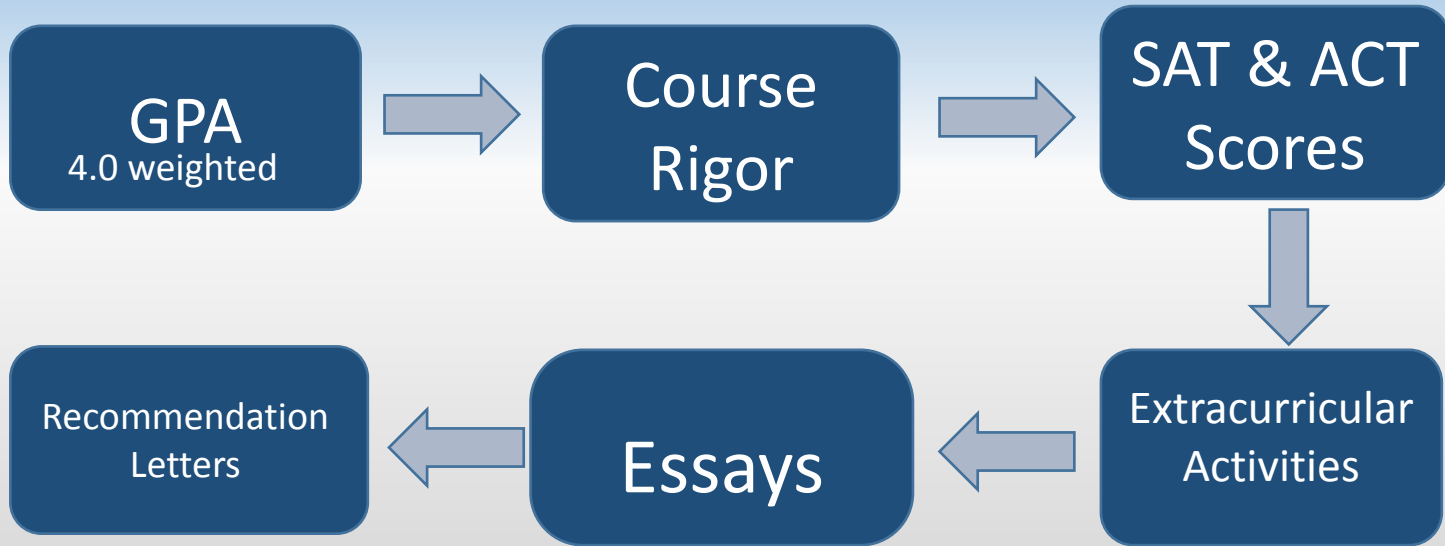


How do I earn CCMR in Texas?

Students can earn CCMR accreditation through their performance on:

- 1. College entrance exams such as the SAT, ACT, and TSIA (Texas Success Initiative Assessment).**
- 2. Taking an AP class and scoring a 3 or better.**
- 3. Dual Credit (earning 9 hours any subject or 3 hours in English)**
- 4. College Prep Class - Online class for math and English (JOIN TODAY)**
- 5. Military enlistment (ie. National Guard, Army, Marines, Navy, Coast Guard)**
- 6. Certification completion (Vet. Tech, CNA, Microsoft Office)**

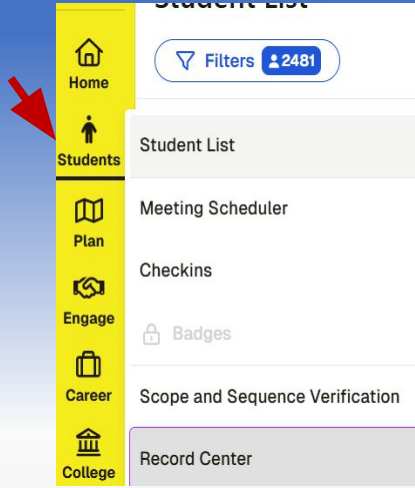

How does FERPA relate to your college application?

- FERPA gives you the right to review letters of recommendation if you are enrolled in college that saves the recommendations, OR you are 18 or older.

To waive or not to waive?

- Waiving your right lets colleges know that you don't intend to read your recommendations, which helps reassure colleges that the letters are candid and truthful.
- If you choose not to waive your right, some recommenders may decline to write a letter for you, and some colleges may disregard letters submitted on your behalf.

Still unsure how to respond?

- That is OK. Many students are. Before you move on, take a moment to discuss your decision with your counselor, another school official, or your parent/legal guardian. You can also read our [FERPA Help Article](#)

Steps Required for Common App Setup

- Link or Create a Common App Account
 - Agree to share with SchoolLinks
 - Add a High School
- When students add their first college they must complete a FERPA Waiver for Common App
- Adding a college can be done in SchoolLinks OR in Common App
- (Optional) Applying for a Fee Waiver on Common App



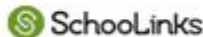


Applying with Common App

1. Students can apply to colleges in a variety of formats, but *applying to Common App schools has a slightly different flow* to simplify the process for you and your students.
2. SchoolLinks integrates and shares information to and from Common App, but many activities happen on Common App.
3. Common App turns all integrations off during the summer until August 1. No connections or data exchanges can happen during that time.

SchoolLinks and Common App

- Some tasks are completed in Common App and some in SchoolLinks- we make it clear for students with this help guide.
- When we send the student to Common App, we explain the process and tell them what they need to do.


