Advanced Placement Exams



Advanced Placement (AP) Exam Self-Study Guidelines

Beginning with the 2025–2026 school year, students may only register for an AP exam if they are currently enrolled in the corresponding AP course—either in-person or virtually. The only exception to this policy is for AP courses not offered at Northview High School; in such cases, students may pursue a self-study option.

To register for a self-study AP exam, students must visit Dr. Bounds' office to obtain a Self-Study Contract, which must be signed by both the student and a parent/guardian. Additionally, the exam fee of \$125 must be paid in full through OSP before registration can be processed.

Important Deadline:

All self-study exam requests must be submitted by **October 1, 2025**. Late submissions will not be accepted under any circumstances.

Please note: If a student registers for an AP exam but does not attend on the scheduled exam day, an unused exam fee of \$75 will be charged.

demonstrate leadership potential, academic commitment, and personal motivation.

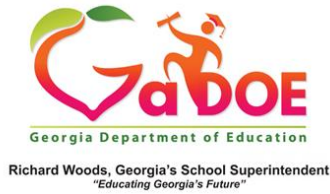

August 1, 2025 – State School Superintendent Richard Woods seeks students in grades 10-12 to serve on his 2025-2026 Student Advisory Council. These students will meet with Superintendent Woods to discuss the impact of state policies in the classroom and other education-related issues. They will also serve as the Superintendent's ambassadors to their respective schools.

Applicants must be enrolled in a Georgia public high school (including charter schools) for the 2025-2026 school year as a sophomore, junior, or senior. Virtual learning students are still considered enrolled. The Student Advisory Council will meet four times in person during the school year; meeting dates are listed in the application.

*Students in grades 10-12 enrolled in a public high school (including charter schools and virtual students) are eligible to apply.

What is the Governor's Honors Program (GHP)?

The Georgia Governor's Honors Program (GHP) is a residential summer program for skilled, knowledgeable, and talented high school juniors and seniors. GHP offers instruction that is significantly different from the typical high school classroom and is designed to provide students with academic, cultural, and social enrichment necessary to become the next generation of global critical thinkers, innovators, and leaders.

Prospective GHP students should know that selection to the Governor's Honors Program is highly competitive.

Students should have passion in the area of nomination, desire to attend GHP in the summer, willingness/ability to live in a residential setting for the full-length of the program, and the capacity to be fully engaged in the curriculum for the duration of the program. This is the minimum threshold for consideration for the program. The most successful student candidates additionally have the attributes, experiences, and skills outlined in the selection criteria provided for their area of nomination.

If you are interested in GHP, speak with a current or past teacher in the nomination area of interest and ask them to submit a nomination form for you. **Teacher nominations are due by 4:00 pm on Tuesday, September 9th.**
