Dear Parents:

I hope this letter finds you well, enjoying the slower pace of summer and spending time with family and friends. While we are having a good summer at Pennsauken High School, the pace has not slowed down at all since the students left us in June. We have been extremely busy preparing for the students return to school in September. I am writing this letter to make everyone aware of some of our key expectations for the upcoming school year!

Let me begin by saying, congratulations to all of my rising seniors that have already met or exceeded the minimum requirements (80 credits) for attaining senior status at Pennsauken High School. To anyone that has not met the minimum requirements it is imperative that you work closely with your guidance counselor to determine where you stand with regards to your graduation status. I am also available to assist you in evaluating your transcript and analyzing your options.

I would also like for everyone to be advised that consistent and prompt attendance at school is vital for success this year. Be reminded that 5 unexcused tardies equals an absence and 7 unexcused absences results in you being remanded to non-credit status. Once you are on non-credit status, if you do not complete credit restoration you will not be able to accumulate credit for the classes you passed.

To conclude, students be reminded that Pennsauken High School does have a mandatory school uniform policy. All students are required to wear navy blue or red polo shirts, crewneck or hooded sweatshirts, with the approved school logo. For warmth students may wear long sleeve t shirts under their polo shirts. Students are not allowed to wear anything over their approved uniform tops. The school uniform tops should be paired with tan khaki, navy blue or black long pants, shorts or skirts. All pants must be one solid color without rips or decorative zippers et cetera. All shorts and skirts must reach to the knee. Students are not allowed to wear athletic attire, denim, or cut off shorts or skirts.

Finally hats, headbands, ascots scarves are not allowed to be worn in the building (Head apparel as part of religious expression or medical reasons supported by verifiable documentation is permitted.)
