Kyrene Long-Range Planning: Important Update

August 28, 2025

Dear Kyrene Community,

Next month, the Kyrene Long-Range Planning Committee will present a recommendation to the Kyrene Governing Board to address Kyrene enrollment trends and maximize the use of school facilities. The committee reached consensus on the recommendation during their final meeting last night.

That recommendation is outlined below, but I strongly recommend you watch the governing board presentation on September 16 for a full picture, with context. No decisions will be made until December at the earliest, to provide ample time for community input.

This is one of the most difficult and deeply emotional things a school district can go through, and the impact will be felt in every one of our school communities. I want to stress that *every* school in **Kyrene is special**, and the recommendation that will go before the board is in no way a reflection of any school's offerings or achievements. Just as every school in Kyrene is important, every school is also impacted by resources that are stretched too thin.

Kyrene's goal is to have better-resourced schools, to maintain the level of excellence our students, staff and families deserve.

Long-Range Plan Recommendation


Kyrene's demographer presented multiple models to right-size the district and consolidate schools. Kyrene currently has six middle schools, two K-8 schools, and 17 elementary schools. The committee will recommend a model with four middle schools and 13 elementary schools. This recommendation is not final until the governing board votes in December.
