THE STUDY SCHOOL FOUNDATION MERIT ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP 2026–2027

A full scholarship will be awarded to the top new student entering Grade 7 for the 2026–2027 school year, based on overall academic excellence, current school reports, the results of The Study's entrance exams, a personal letter of intent, and an interview. The value of the full scholarship will be applied against school fees each year until the student graduates, provided that she continues to achieve proficiency and actively participates in school life. Please note that this scholarship is awarded once every three years. It will next be awarded to a Grade 7 student entering in 2029.

Applicants must submit a 300-word, handwritten letter outlining*:

- Why she is applying for this prestigious scholarship
- What the scholarship would mean to her, should she be the recipient
- How she plans on being an active member of The Study community

*Although not encouraged, please indicate whether generative AI tools were used to write the letter and cite the source.

The deadline for receipt of this letter and the application is **September 26, 2025**.

ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

(Up to \$5,000 and renewable for two years)

Awarded annually to new incoming Grade 7 students on the basis of overall academic excellence and potential to contribute to school life.

MARGARET GASCOIGNE SCHOLARSHIP

(\$1,000 per year, for five years)

Named after the school's founder, this scholarship is awarded to a top new incoming Grade 7 student on the basis of academic excellence and a personal interview.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The financial assistance programme reflects the school's commitment to financially assisting the families of students who would benefit from and contribute to The Study experience. The decision to award financial assistance is based on a family's demonstrated financial need, as determined by a third-party assessment.

MARCELLE GAUDION SCHOLARSHIP

(\$1,000 and renewable for five or six years)

Awarded annually to a current student in Grade 4 or 5, based on a French essay and a personal interview.

BOARD OF GOVERNORS' SCHOLARSHIP

(\$1,000 and renewable for two years)

Awarded annually to a current Grade 6 student entering the Senior School based on an essay (written in either English or French) and personal interview.

DARE-TO-DREAM FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

(\$2,000 non-renewable)

Awarded annually to a current Grade 8 student entering Grade 9 who has been at The Study since Grade 3 or 4 and possesses an 80% overall average and can demonstrate a positive vision for the future of her community. Dare to Dream Scholarships are in honour of the school's transformational Campaign Cabinet, led by Jean-Guy Desjardins (father of Olivia '23 and Chloe '24) and Randy Kelly (father of Sydney '19).

TRILLIUM SCHOLARSHIP

(\$1,000 and renewable for one year)

Awarded to a current Grade 9 student entering Grade 10 and is based on an essay (written in either English or French) and a personal interview.

NANCY LEWIS SWEER—LEADER OF TOMORROW SCHOLARSHIP

(\$2,000)

This scholarship, in honour of our retired Head of School, Mrs. Nancy Lewis Sweer, recognizes a current Grade 10 student entering Grade 11 who has demonstrated outstanding dedication and leadership to fellow students and to her community.
