Academic Credits



High School Credit

- The Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) requires students to earn 24 credits to graduate.
- Credits are issued by semester:
 $\frac{1}{2}$ credit per class, per semester
- Athletic Eligibility: must earn 6 credits per semester to be eligible to participate in MSHSAA Sponsored Activities

Policies & Procedures



Before School Policy

- **Students remain in Commons or Theatre Atrium until bell rings at 8:15 am.**
- **No students should be in any other part of the building without permission.**
- WHY? Safety is our priority. Adult supervision is mandatory.
NO Exceptions.
- **Adults will be stationed in those areas and will hold you in those areas until 8:15 am bell rings.**

During School Hours

- ◆ Students should be in their assigned areas at all times.
- ◆ Students who are in the hallways should always have a pass.
- ◆ Students will use the colored lanyard system to use the restroom- the color of pass will match color of restroom.
- ◆ Students NEED to be where they are supposed to be, when they are supposed to be there! NO EXCEPTIONS.
- ◆ It is NOT a student's responsibility to "help" a friend find where they are going. Students need to concentrate on their OWN academic success.

Arrival/Dismissal Procedures

- Students arriving late to school should sign in (with School Pass ID) in the Welcome Center atrium with a parent note.
- Students leaving during school hours should take a parent note to their grade level office in order to get an early dismissal pass.

Lunch

- Students will have 30 minutes to eat.
- Students will stay in the Commons or courtyard during lunch.
- There are bathrooms in the Commons, so no need to leave or be in any other parts of the building.
- Pick up your trash as it is not the responsibility of others to pick up after you.
- Push your chairs in or help stack chairs if you eat third lunch.
- If you spill something, please let an adult know so we can help. You are responsible for crumbs, wrappers on your table.

After School Policy

- **Students must leave campus by 3:30pm.**
- WHY? Safety is our priority. Adult supervision is mandatory: NO Exceptions.
- If a student is with one of the following, they may remain on campus for the duration of the activity:
 - Teacher/Administrator, Coach/Sponsor, Librarian
- Students cannot just hang out after school; they must be supervised. If you are attending an after school sporting event, you must have a ride pre-arranged for pickup after the event.

After School Policy-Buses

- **Students must sign up for Activities Buses in any office by 12:00 PM***
- **4:30pm buses start in early September**
- Activity Buses:
 - 4:30pm Tuesday and Thursday
- Athletic Buses:
 - Students participating in VICC Program: 6:15 pm Monday through Thursday and 5:00pm Friday
- Violation of the policy will result in loss of after school privileges.

Academic Lab (AcLab)

- You will have the same Homeroom teacher throughout your 4 years at EHS.
- Students sign up for AcLabs through Infinite Campus during their Homeroom classes or beforehand.
- You have to sign up so we know where you are.
- Sign up for classes on your schedule.
- If you are struggling with a class, sign up to visit your teacher for that class.
 - If you need help in Social Studies, do not sign up for PE.
 - PE AcLabs are reserved for students needing to complete PE make- ups.
- Mandatory AcLabs may be assigned at the grade level principals discretion.

A teacher may request you to come to their AcLab session which locks you out of making your own selection for that session.

If you do not sign up, there will be disciplinary action.

Cell Phones & Smartwatches

- Cell phones must be powered off or silenced and kept out of sight during the school day.
- Smartwatches may not be used as communication devices.
- Any use outside of designated times or without permission will be considered a violation of school expectations.

Earbuds & Headphones

- Earbuds and headphones are not allowed during school hours unless specifically directed by a teacher for instructional purposes.
- Students are expected to remain engaged in classroom discussions, lectures, and activities.

Laptops & Devices

- School-issued laptops should only be used for educational purposes. When not in use, they must remain at a 45-degree angle to stay visible and minimize distractions.
- Personal laptops, Chromebooks, or other personal electronic devices are not permitted at school.
- Teachers may provide additional guidelines for laptop use for educational and instructional purposes.

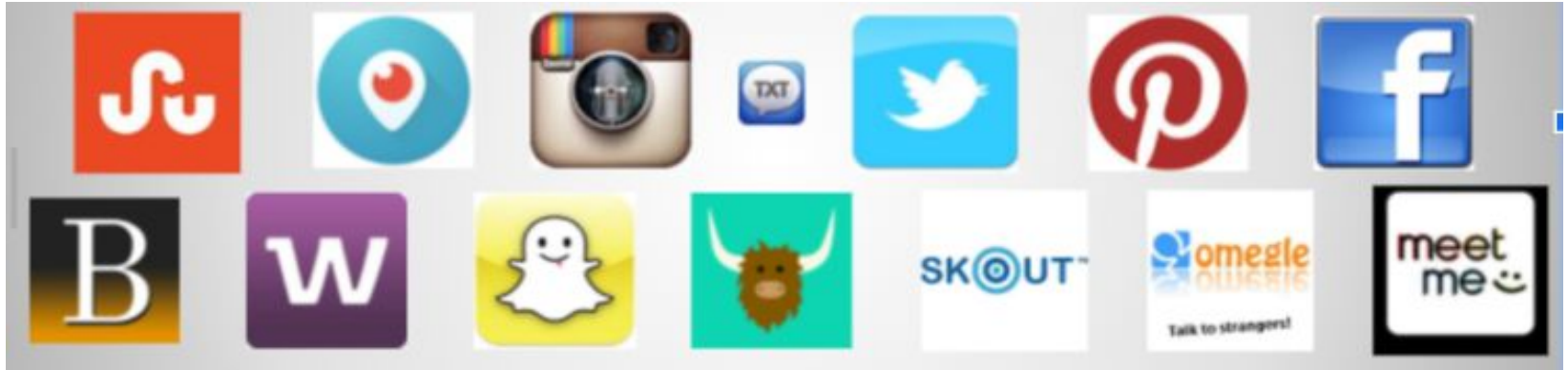

If there is a emergency or emergency drill during lunch or passing periods, students will go to their PREVIOUS class to check in with their teacher

Discipline



Attendance/Tardies

- Attendance and punctuality have a direct impact on a student's academic success.
- Teachers will take daily class attendance.
- Chronic absenteeism and/or tardiness will be addressed by EHS grade level administrators who will have meetings with you and your student if attendance becomes an issue.
- Daily class attendance and grade alert notifications will be sent to any phone number set up through Infinite Campus.

Tardies

- 3rd Tardy — warning
- 4th Tardy — detention
- 5th Tardy — detention
- 6th Tardy — detention
- 7th Tardy — 2 hour Sat. detention
- 8th Tardy — 4 hour Sat. detention
- 9th+ Tardy — ISS/OSS

Discipline

High school students should already be aware of generally-accepted behaviors in the different situations at school.

- A positive environment for learning can exist only through the cooperation of students, parents, staff and administration.
- Discipline is used to help students develop appropriate behaviors. If the misbehavior continues, the disciplinary measures may have increased consequences.

Disciplinary Actions

Progression of Discipline:

- Detention: Served Monday – Thursday after school.
- Saturday detention: 2 or 4 hours
- In School Suspension – ISS
- Out of School Suspension – OSS
- Out of School Suspension with referral to Superintendent for additional days
- Long-Term ISS

Dress Code

Students will dress in a manner that shows respect to all who attend/work at EHS.

Clothing will not display:

- suggestive, obscene, or inappropriate writing or pictures.
- alcohol, tobacco, or drugs.

The EHS dress code applies to everyone regardless of gender.

Academic Honesty & AI

The district will not tolerate any form of academic dishonesty.

Incidents of academic dishonesty can be reported to colleges.

Academic Dishonesty: Includes, but is not limited to:

- bringing answers into a testing area,
 - copying homework or assessments from another student,
 - providing answers for another student,
 - using unauthorized notes or technology,
 - taking credit for work that one didn't do by failing to acknowledge author, parent, friend, or tutor assistance.
 - Usage of artificial intelligence programs and passing them off as own work**
- AI - [academic dishonesty](#) Full Policy in Student Handbook

Tobacco/e-Cigs/Vape/etc.

Possession, Use, Sale or Transfer of any tobacco products by students is prohibited. As is:

- **Smoke coming from your mouth or nose.**
- **Smoke coming from area occupied by students.**
- **Possession or use of electronic, “vapor/vape” or other delivery devices, substitute forms of cigarettes or any other tobacco/cbd/thc innovation device.**
 - **May lead to a search of student items, car and locker.**

These items are NOT allowed on campus at any time.

Violation Consequences:

- 1st offense: Minimum 3 Days ISS
- 2nd offense: Minimum 3 Days OSS
- 3rd offense: Minimum 5 Days OSS

Policy 2130 - Harassment

Harassment is not tolerated at Eureka High School and in the Rockwood School District.

Please refer to and familiarize yourself with Policy 2130 in the Student Handbook to ensure you are adhering to this policy.



Bullying

- “Intimidation, unwarranted aggressive behavior, or harassment that is repetitive or is substantially likely to be repeated and causes a reasonable student to fear for his or her physical safety or property, substantially interferes with the educational performance, opportunities or benefits of any student without exception: or substantially disrupts the orderly operation of the school.”
- Bullying may consist of physical actions, including gestures, or oral, cyberbullying, electronic, or written communication, and any threat of retaliation for reporting such acts.”

Athletics & Eligibility

- Students MUST pass 3.0 Credits (6 classes) the semester prior in order to be eligible for the current semester in MSHSAA Activities.
- Fall Semester Grades impact 2nd half of Winter Activities & Spring Activities.
- Spring Semester Grades impact Fall Semester & 1st half of Winter Activities.
- For NCAA eligibility in college, students must earn credit in 16 core courses (LA, MA, SS, Sci).
