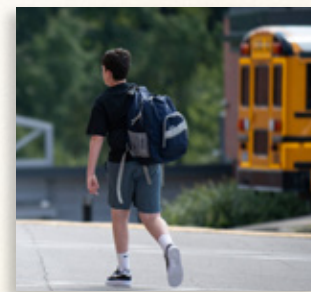
REGISTRATION INFORMATION

PRESCHOOL [AGES 3-5]

A preschool program is offered through the Family and Consumer Science Department of the senior high school. The program runs on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from October through May. Session I is 8:55–10:55 a.m. and Session II is 11:50 a.m.–1:50 p.m. Cost is \$180/year. Children must live in the district or have parents who work for Seneca Valley School District. Children must be toilet trained and three years of age on or before September 1. Parents are asked to follow the district school cancellation schedule.

ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY STUDENTS [K-12]



Students can register year-round in the district. Those students entering AM or PM kindergarten in Seneca Valley School District must be five years old on or before September 1.

For all students in grades K-12, you will need:

- A birth certificate
- Health and immunization records
- Two proofs of residency

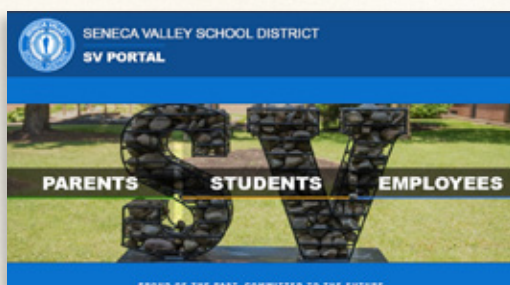
SCHOOLMESSENGER PARENT NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

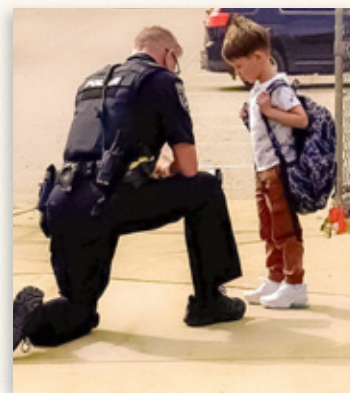

VISITOR NOTICE



Ensuring the safety of our students and staff remains our foremost priority, and we are dedicated to implementing proactive measures to uphold a secure learning atmosphere. We kindly request your cooperation with the following guidelines during your visits:

Regardless of age, the Seneca Valley School District strictly prohibits the presence of alcohol, drugs, weapons, firearms (applies to concealed carry permit holders), tobacco and any electronic device [Vape device] used to ingest nicotine, THC or any other chemical on any school premises. All individuals, vehicles, and belongings on school grounds are subject to inspection, and unauthorized access is prohibited.

Visitors to all K-12 buildings will undergo screening via the District's Weapons Detection System before gaining entry. This system will also be operational during after-school events like sports games, performances, and graduations to ensure comprehensive screening. Designed to seamlessly blend in with surroundings, akin to security measures at concerts or major sporting events, it facilitates smooth traffic flow while maintaining high levels of security.

Please be aware that video surveillance monitors all school entrances and key areas within buildings. Additionally, all visitors must sign in and obtain a visitor's badge using a valid driver's license, which must be worn at all times while on school grounds. When departing, visitors are required to sign out and return their badge to the office staff.

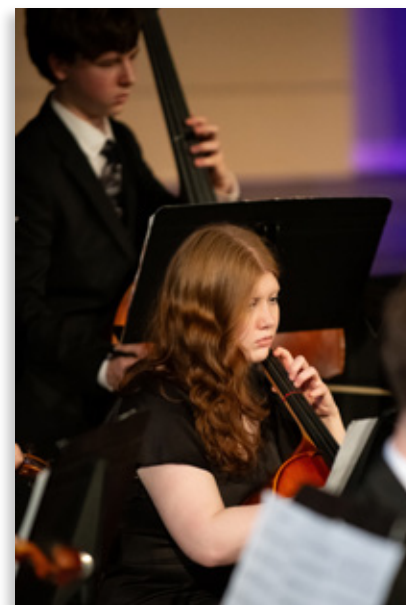

ACTIVITY BUS

We're excited to offer the Activity Bus—a free service that helps students stay involved in after-school activities without needing a second trip back to campus.

WHAT IS THE ACTIVITY BUS?

The Activity Bus gives students a ride home after they participate in supervised after-school programs at the secondary campus. It drops students off at central locations in their local communities—not at individual homes.

ACTIVITY BUS SCHEDULE

- Runs Monday through Friday
- Departs at 5:15 p.m. from Seneca Valley secondary schools in Jackson Township

ACTIVITY BUS STOPS

- The bus stops at main roads only and does not go into housing plans or developments.
- Students should know their street name and neighborhood to help them get off at the right stop.

TRANSPORTATION NOTIFICATION

In accordance with Pennsylvania Law Act 9 of 2014, the School Board has adopted a policy that authorizes audio and/or video recording on school buses or school vehicles for disciplinary or security purposes. The audio/video recordings on school vehicles would be exempt from disclosure under the Public Right to Know Law because such recordings constitute an educational record protected from disclosure by FERPA. Principals, their designees, bus garage managers, and transportation department personnel are the only people allowed to view the recordings. Law enforcement may also view the recordings if school officials deem necessary. Each school bus or school vehicle with audio and/or video recording devices, will post a notification in clear sight so driver and passengers understand their actions and communication may be recorded. The audio and or video recording will not be operating if the vehicle is used for other purposes not school related.

EMERGENCY/INCLEMENT WEATHER NOTICE



The Seneca Valley School District will make every effort to close or delay school by 5:30 a.m. of the affected school day. Delays that turn into closures will be made by 7:30 a.m. of the affected day. Please know that early dismissals will be avoided whenever possible, but, if necessary, will be made by 11 a.m. of the affected day. When Seneca Valley has a closing or delay, the district will notify the primary and secondary numbers, as

FOOD SERVICES

FREE/REDUCED MEAL APPLICATIONS

If you think you might be eligible for Free and Reduced-Price School Meals, please fill out the Free and Reduced-Price School Meals Application and return it to the Seneca Valley Administration Office with attention to Faye Nelson. We encourage you to fill out a Free and Reduced-Price School Meals Application as many programs are connected to your child[ren]'s eligibility. Applications can be found at svsd.net/FreeandReduced.

CAFETERIA POINT OF SALE [POS] PROGRAM INFORMATION



The Seneca Valley School District Food Service Department uses a point of sale [POS] system called e-Triton and all schools use a pin pad. This system allows a student to enter their ID numbers with a touch screen. The POS system automates the purchase of all cafeteria meals and items, monitors student allergies, creates a student history and maintains student balance. To make cafeteria item purchases, a student must have a positive balance on their account. Charged meals will accrue until graduation or separation. A student cannot be denied a meal. We are proud to offer a wide variety of unlimited fruits and vegetables with all student meals. Please encourage your child to try something new.

PAY STUDENT MEALS ONLINE

Seneca Valley accepts payments for school meals through the MySchoolBucks.com online payment service. You can also use the service to monitor, for free, your child's food purchases. MySchoolBucks.com offers a secure gateway that accepts VISA and MasterCard or debit cards as a means of adding money to your child's account.

There is no fee to use the MySchoolBucks service to set up an account, view your child's meal purchases, balances, or to set up automated email notices when your child's meal account falls below a dollar amount you specify. There is a fee if you are using the MySchoolBucks service to make an online payment. If using the service to pay for meals, the service automatically deposits the money into the student's meal account at school within one-to-two business days.

To register online, visit MySchoolBucks.com. You can register each child using their date of birth and student identification number; and be sure to enter your child's name exactly as you did when you registered them at school. A valid email address is required when you sign up for the service.

If leaving the district or graduating, refunds will be handled through the cafeteria manager or by contacting Faye Nelson in Food Services by calling 724.452.6040, ext. 1655 or by email at nelsonfd@svsd.net.

CAFETERIA PAYMENT PROCEDURES



Funds may be added to a student account by registering at MySchoolBucks.com. Parents are encouraged to use MySchoolBucks to track cafeteria balances but can send a check or cash to your school's cafeteria to avoid paying a processing fee on MySchoolBucks. Please make sure the student's full name and enclosed dollar amount is on the outside of an envelope along with the ID number on the inside flap. If you have multiple children in different schools, it is preferred that you provide separate checks. If you are utilizing one check for multiple accounts, please specify the account numbers and amount to be deposited on each account in the memo line. Cash transactions are acceptable but not preferred. The goal is to have money on all accounts in an effort to speed up the lines and afford the children more time to eat.

A student may ask any cashier for an account balance, and the cashier will notify the student at the point of service. Parents will also receive an email from the district when funds are low. Please remit payment as soon as possible. We ask that all negative balances are taken care of by June 30th.

An account balance must be positive in order for a student to purchase an a la carte item. Parents may limit the student's purchases to "meals only" or "one a la carte per day." This can only be done by email to the cafeteria manager or by contacting Faye Nelson in the food service department at nelsonfd@svsd.net, who will then post this message to the student account. If an elementary or secondary student does not bring a lunch or does not have enough money to buy a lunch, they will be offered a charged meal of their choice. Parents are notified via email on low or negative balances.

You must have an email registered with the school to receive this message service. If you have not registered an email address, please do so through the SV Portal, which can be found at the top right hand of the website in the blue bar or visit <https://portal.svsd.net>.

At the Seneca Valley School District, we prioritize supporting the whole child. We understand that students may face a variety of challenges, and we respond to their mental health and wellness needs with compassion, expertise and individualized support.

Our team of school psychologists, counselors, behavioral specialists, administrators, and student services staff work collaboratively in every building to support student well-being. While many needs can be met through our in-district programs, there are times when additional support can be helpful.

In such cases, our staff can connect families with appropriate resources, including school-based therapy. We also offer access to community-based supports, including an anonymous referral system and a comprehensive list of services, all available at svsd.net/help.

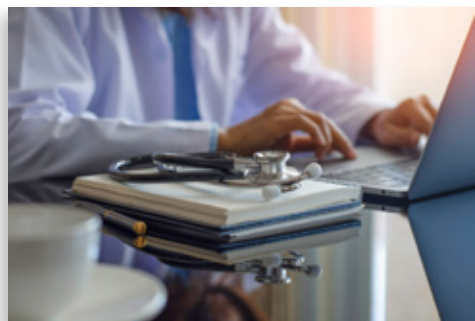

HEALTH SERVICES

The goal of the School Nurse Department of the Seneca Valley School District is to provide the resources to promote the greatest health care services for each student in our care. Those services include:

- Implementation of an Individual Health Plan [IHP] for any student with specific health needs
- Collaboration with parents, school staff and community health agencies
- Health assessments and screenings
- Implementation of state health and immunization laws



If your child has a specific health concern that requires medication or nursing care during school hours, please call the school nurse; a plan will be developed for your child. Medication, when necessary, may be administered to students at school. All medications administered in the school setting must be prescribed in writing by a health care professional [physician/dentist/CRNP]. The original pharmacy labeled container may also be accepted as the physician/dentist/CRNP order for medications administered for a period of two [2] weeks or less. All medications administered in the school setting must also be accompanied by a written request or completion of form[s] from the parent/guardian.

- Medication forms are available in each health office and online at www.svsd.net. Orders are in effect for no longer than the duration of the current school year.
- Analgesics—Ibuprofen [e.g., Motrin, Advil, etc.] and or acetaminophen [e.g., Tylenol] may be administered to students for mild pain and discomfort upon parental permission. The dosage of these analgesics will be administered according to orders as written by the school physician. Dosage will be determined by the student's weight. Dosages that exceed those recommended by the school physician WILL NOT be administered without a written order from the student's personal physician.
- All medications must be delivered directly to the school nurse, school principal, or principal's designee in properly labeled containers. Students may only carry Epi Pens and asthma inhalers with physician's order, parent permission and school nurse approval.

Medication guidelines to be followed:

- Prescription medications require the original pharmacy labeled container.
- Over-the-counter medications are required to be in the original labeled package.
- The parent/guardian is responsible for providing an adequate supply of medication.
- If the parent/guardian is unable to make arrangements for delivery of controlled medications by an adult, the medication container should be sent to school with the student in a sealed envelope with a note stating the number of pills being sent. Upon receipt of the medication, the school nurse will verify the number of pills and notify the parent/guardian of any discrepancy.

- The school nurse will contact the parent/guardian if the nurse, in his/her professional judgment, needs clarification regarding implementation of a medication order. The nurse will ask the parent/guardian for permission to speak directly with the prescribing physician. If the parent/guardian will not permit the nurse to clarify the order directly with the physician or the parent/guardian does not provide the necessary clarification from the physician in writing to the nurse in an agreed upon amount of time, the parent/guardian must assume the responsibility for administering the medication at school.
- Students will be responsible for reporting to the health office at the designated time to receive the medication.

PA School Health Law requires a physical examination and dental examinations for the following grade levels:

- Physical examinations for kindergarten, grade 6, grade 11
- Dental examinations for kindergarten, grade 3, grade 7

Please submit ALL forms to the nurse when complete.

PA STATE-MANDATED IMMUNIZATIONS

Pennsylvania Law and Seneca Valley School District requires that all immunization mandates be completed prior to the first day of school.

Children in ALL grades [K-12] need the following immunizations for attendance:

- 4 doses of DTaP (diphtheria, tetanus, and acellular pertussis [1 dose on or after fourth birthday])
- 4 doses of polio [1 dose on or after fourth birthday and at least six months after previous dose given]

- 2 doses of MMR [measles, mumps, rubella] [1st dose must be after the 1st birthday]
- 3 doses of hepatitis B
- 2 doses of varicella [chickenpox] or evidence of immunity [1st dose must be after the 1st birthday]

Grade 7 ADDITIONAL immunization requirements:

- 1 dose meningococcal conjugate vaccine [MCV]
- 1 dose of tetanus, diphtheria, acellular pertussis [Tdap] [if five years have elapsed since last tetanus immunization]

Grade 12 ADDITIONAL immunization requirement:

- 2nd dose meningococcal conjugate vaccine [MCV] They must be at 16 years of age or older. [If the first MCV was given at age 16, then they only need one.]

Exemptions to the school laws for immunizations are:

- Medical reasons
- Religious beliefs
- Philosophical/strong moral or ethical conviction

If your child is exempt from immunizations, he/she may be removed from school during an outbreak.

SPECIAL EDUCATION



The Seneca Valley School District is committed to meeting the needs of students with disabilities in the least restrictive environment and helping them reach their potential while maintaining compliance with state and federal regulations. If a student demonstrates a potential need for special education, a multidisciplinary evaluation is conducted to determine if the child has a disability and is in need of special education services. The evaluation process may be initiated by school staff or by a child's parent, who may do so by contacting the building administration. The amount and type of special education services to be received by a student is determined on an individual basis by the Individualized Education Program (IEP) team, of which the parent is a very important member. The Seneca Valley School District offers a continuum of services and placement options to meet the needs of each student. Services include but are not limited to:

- **Autistic Support:** May be recommended for a student with a disability who requires services to address needs primarily in the areas of communication, social skills or behavior. This is consistent with those on the autism spectrum.
- **Emotional Support:** May be recommended for a student with a disability who requires services primarily in the areas of social or emotional skills development or functional behavior.
- **Learning Support:** May be recommended for a student with a disability who requires services primarily in the areas of reading, writing, mathematics or speaking/listening skills related to academic performance.
- **Life Skills Support:** May be recommended for a student with a disability who requires services primarily in the areas of academic, functional or vocational skills necessary for independent living.
- **Speech and Language Support:** May be recommended for students with speech and language impairments who require services primarily in the areas of communication or use of assistive technologies designed to provide or facilitate the development of communication capacity or skills.

SECTION 504 SERVICES



At the Seneca Valley School District, we are dedicated to ensuring all students have equal access to education and opportunities. Students who qualify for a Section 504 Service Agreement must be of school age and have a physical or mental condition that significantly limits one or more major life activities. In line with state and federal laws, Seneca Valley provides eligible students with the supports, services, or accommodations they need to fully participate in school programs and extracurricular activities. These supports are based on each student's unique needs and abilities.

GIFTED EDUCATION

The Seneca Valley School District is also committed to meeting the needs of gifted students by ensuring that they are served through a comprehensive program designed to develop their strengths and potential. If a student demonstrates a potential need for gifted services, a multidisciplinary evaluation is conducted to determine if the child is in need of special programming. The evaluation process may be initiated by school staff or by a child's parent, who may do so by contacting administration. The amount and type of gifted support to be received by a student is determined on an individual basis annually by the child's Gifted Individualized Education Program [GIEP] team, of which the parent is a very important member.

- **Gifted Support:** Students receiving gifted support have been identified as having outstanding intellectual ability, the development of which requires special services and activities not ordinarily provided in the general program.

Acceptable proof of residency includes valid PA driver's license or identification card with a Seneca Valley School District community address, lease, or utility bill [name on the application must match the name on the license/ identification]. A Gold Card application can be made by mail and must include a copy of proof of residency.

- You must carry your card with you and present it to admissions personnel when you wish to use it

DISCRIMINATION/TITLE IX SEXUAL HARASSMENT POLICY [103] NONDISCRIMINATION – QUALIFIED STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES [103.1] DISCRIMINATION/TITLE IX SEXUAL HARASSMENT AFFECTING STAFF [104]

The policy of this district is to provide an equal opportunity for all students to achieve their maximum potential through the programs and activities offered in the schools – and to all categories of employment in this District - regardless of race, color, age, creed, religion, sex, gender, sexual orientation, genetic information, ancestry, national origin, marital status, pregnancy, or handicap/disability. The Board also declares it to be the policy of this district to comply with federal law and regulations under Title IX prohibiting sexual harassment, which is a form of unlawful discrimination on the basis of sex. Violations of this policy may result in disciplinary consequences under applicable Board policy and procedures.

COMMUNICABLE DISEASES AND IMMUNIZATIONS POLICY [203]

All students shall be immunized against certain diseases in accordance with Pennsylvania statutes, unless specifically exempt for religious or medical reasons. As part of the health record, a certificate of immunization shall be maintained for each student enrolled, as established by the Pennsylvania Department of Health. A student who has not been immunized in accordance with state regulations shall not be admitted to or permitted to attend district schools, unless exempted for medical or religious reasons, or provisionally admitted by the Superintendent or designee after beginning a multiple dose vaccine series and submitting proof of immunization or a medical certificate on or before the fifth school day of attendance. Homeless students who have not been immunized or are unable to provide immunization records due to being homeless shall be admitted in accordance with the provisions of applicable law and regulations. Foster care students and students transferring into a school within the Commonwealth shall be admitted in accordance with law and regulations, and shall have thirty [30] days to provide proof of immunization, a medical certificate detailing the plan to complete a multiple dose vaccine series or to satisfy the requirements for an exemption.

ATTENDANCE POLICY [204]

Irregular school attendance results in lowering the level of a student's academic achievement in addition to placing a burden on teachers who attempt to help absentees keep abreast of classwork and meet the needs of the other students. Patterns of regular and faithful attendance that carry over into adult life and post high school responsibilities must be strongly encouraged. A student shall not be granted

credit for any semester course if unexcused absences from that course total more than five [5] periods per semester or for any full year courses that total more than ten [10] periods for the year. Class period absences may include but not be limited to illness, truancy, vacations, parent/guardian sponsored educational experiences, college visitations, service-related tests or physicals, and doctor appointments. A student is not considered absent from class if s/he has been physically present any part of the period. Students will be afforded the opportunity to complete assignments, classwork, and tests missed during an unexcused absence. However, students will not receive credit and will be assigned a score of zero [0] for any such assignments, classwork, or tests missed during an unexcused absence. Students of compulsory age having illegal absences will also be subject to the attendance laws prescribed by the Pennsylvania School Code of 1949. Students who are eighteen [18] years old or older do not come under the compulsory attendance law. Therefore, their unexcused absence[s] will result in notices mailed to parents/guardians and possible loss of credit for the affected course[s]. Attendance regulations require that a student who is absent for ten [10] consecutive school days be removed from the active roster unless there is evidence that the absence is legal or that there is evidence that compulsory attendance prosecution is under way.

REPORTING STUDENT PROGRESS POLICY [212]

The Board believes that the cooperation of school and home is a vital ingredient in the growth and education of the whole child. It recognizes its responsibility to keep parents/guardians informed of student welfare and progress in school. Beginning with the class of 2024, graduation speakers will be selected utilizing the following procedures:

- At the conclusion of the third grading period, the top two percent [2%] of students in the class will be offered the opportunity to try out for two [2] speaker positions.
- The remainder of the graduating class will be offered the opportunity to try out for one [1] at-large speaker position.
- The class president of the graduation class will complete the "turning of the tassel."

All valedictorians and salutatorians will be recognized during the graduation ceremony.

RECORDS POLICY [216]

As a parent of a student in the Seneca Valley School District you have certain rights which are guaranteed by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 1974 and the Pa. State Board of Education's Regulations. You have the right to review, inspect, or obtain a copy of the records. You may make a written request for copies of your child's records for a fee. If you believe that any information is inaccurate or misleading, you may challenge the contents of the records. You have the right to refuse consent where such permission is needed for

releasing certain student information. Should you feel the district is not providing these rights, you may file a complaint with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act Office. Various non-confidential information can be released to outside agencies without your consent. This directory information consists of name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, major field of study, honors won and offices held, recognition for achievements, recognition of graduating seniors, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weights and heights of members of athletic teams, dates and attendance. If you do not want directory information about your child released and/or to view such info., notify the building principal in writing by September. Students or their parents or guardians who wish to "opt out" of having their information shared with military recruiters or institutions of higher education or both should also send a detailed written request to your child's school by the end of September. To request a copy of this policy, call the Assistant Superintendent's office at 724.452.6040, ext. 1760.

WEAPONS POLICY [218.1]

Possession of weapons in the school environment is a threat to the safety of students and staff and is prohibited by law. The Board prohibits students from possessing and bringing weapons and replicas of weapons into any school district buildings, onto school property, to any school-sponsored activity, and onto any public conveyance providing transportation to school or a school-sponsored activity. The school district shall expel for a period of not less than one [1] year any student who violates this weapons policy. Such expulsion shall be given in conformance with formal due process proceedings required by law. The Superintendent may recommend modifications of such expulsion requirement on a case-by case basis and/or require student[s] to undergo extensive individual counseling. In the case of an exceptional student, the Superintendent shall take all necessary steps to comply with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

TERRORISTIC THREATS/ACTS POLICY [218.2]

The board prohibits any district student from communicating terroristic threats or committing terroristic acts directed at any student, employee, board member, community member or school building. The school district will recommend expulsion and may seek restitution for all costs incurred when a student's conduct results in the evacuation of school district property. A student may also be charged with criminal violations. The district will exercise the right to conduct random metal detector searches or unannounced weapon sweeps.

DRESS AND GROOMING [221]

The Board recognizes that each student's mode of dress and grooming is a manifestation of personal style and individual preference. The Board has the authority to impose limitations on students' dress in school. The Board will not interfere with the right of students and their parents/guardians to make decisions regarding their appearance,

except when their choices disrupt the educational program of the schools or constitute a health or safety hazard. The Board encourages students to project themselves to other students, staff and visiting guests in a manner that honors the atmosphere of learning in a school environment. Students may be required to wear certain types of clothing while participating in physical education classes, technical education, extracurricular activities or other situations where special attire may be required to ensure the health or safety of the student and/or others around them.

TOBACCO USE POLICY [222]

The Board prohibits tobacco use and possession of tobacco, electronic cigarettes or any tobacco-related device by students at any time in a school building and on any property, buses, vans and vehicles that are owned, leased or controlled by the school district.

SUBSTANCE USE/ABUSE POLICY [227]

Seneca Valley School District prohibits the possession, use, misuse, being under the influence of, or the distribution by students and unauthorized personnel of drugs [controlled, noncontrolled or mood-altering substances], look-alikes, designer drugs, drug paraphernalia, health endangering substances, medication not registered with the health office, or alcohol on school district property, at any school-sponsored event, in any conveyance providing transportation to or from school or school-sponsored events, while traveling to or from school or school sponsored events or during activities under school district jurisdiction. Students in violation of this policy will be suspended and may be expelled. Students suspected of illegal activities will be referred to law enforcement. The district will conduct random drug sweeps at various times throughout the year.

DRUG AND ALCOHOL AWARENESS FOR ATHLETIC PROGRAMS, EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES AND STUDENT DRIVERS POLICY [227.1]

This policy encompasses all students in grades 7-12 wishing to participate in any interscholastic athletic activity, any extracurricular activity, or those who meet the district's guidelines to drive on campus and wish to obtain a parking permit. The policy includes those students being educated by the district under special circumstances, including home schooling. The district welcomes all referenced students, with the permission of their parents/guardians, to participate in the program. Those students who are not seeking privileges for parking, participating on athletic teams or an extracurricular activity will be considered voluntary participants. The district will require any student who is submitting to testing and the student's custodial parent/guardian to consent in writing to drug testing pursuant to the district's drug testing program using the form provided by the district. No student should be able to participate in any interscholastic sport, any

extracurricular activity or to obtain a parking permit without such consent.

RESPONSIBLE USE OF PERSONAL TECHNOLOGY RESOURCES POLICY [237]

The Board, while recognizing that technology is an essential element of 21st century education, adopts this policy to establish guidelines for the use of personal technology resources in order to minimize disruptions to and maintain a safe educational environment. Student smartphones or other personal electronic communication devices ["devices"] may come to school but must be stowed on your person and out of sight or stored in a locker or backpack. These devices should be turned off and placed in silent or vibrate mode during the school hours. In addition, for grades K-12, devices may not be used during the school day. For extracurricular activities, device use would be left to the discretion of the coach or sponsor.

HAZING POLICY [247]

The board does not condone any form of hazing, which is any activity that recklessly or intentionally endangers the mental health, physical health or safety of a student for the purpose of initiation or membership in or affiliation with any organization. Any hazing activity, whether by an individual or a group, shall be presumed to be a forced activity, even if a student willingly participates. The district will investigate all complaints of hazing and will administer appropriate discipline to any individual who violates this policy.

EMPLOYMENT OF PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYEES [EQUAL OPPORTUNITY EMPLOYER] [404]

The Seneca Valley School District will not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, age, sex, disability or any other legally protected classification in the employment or in the administration of any of its educational programs and activities. Announcement of this policy is in accordance with state and federal laws including Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972, Sections 503 and 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. To inquire about, obtain a copy of or to file a complaint relating to this policy, contact Human Resources at SVSD, 124 Seneca School Road, Harmony, PA, 16037 or call 724.452.6040, ext. 1760.

CHILD ABUSE POLICY [806]

It is the objective of the Seneca Valley School District to provide a safe environment for district students and staff. School employees, independent contractors, anyone supervised or managed by such school employees and independent contractors and volunteers who are directly responsible for or has direct contact with children, or anyone who on the basis of the individual's role as an integral part of a regularly scheduled program, activity or service is

responsible for the child's welfare or has direct contact with children ["Reporters"], shall make a report of suspected child abuse if they have reasonable cause to suspect that a child is the victim of child abuse under any of the following circumstances:

- The Reporter comes into contact with the child in the course of employment, occupation and the practice of a profession or through a regularly scheduled program, activity or service.
- The Reporter volunteer is directly responsible for the care, supervision, guidance or training of the child.
- A person makes a specific disclosure to a Reporter that an identifiable child is the victim of child abuse.
- An individual fourteen [14] years of age or older makes a specific disclosure to a Reporter that s/he has committed child abuse.
- A child is not required to come before the school employee, independent contractor or volunteer in order for that individual to make a report of suspected child abuse.

PUBLICATIONS PROGRAM POLICY [MEDIA/WEBSITE NOTICE] [902]

As part of an on-going process to generate good news about our schools, the Seneca Valley School District will be inviting the media inside our classrooms to learn about our outstanding academic programs and events. We will also publicize events and activities via our website at www.svsd.net. Parents/Guardians who do not wish to have their child's name, photograph or other personal information to appear in any media or district publications, including but not limited to, the internet, newspapers, magazines, etc., must submit written documentation to the appropriate building principal.

SCHOOL VOLUNTEERS POLICY [VOLUNTEER CLEARANCE PROCEDURES] [916]

In an effort to safeguard the well-being of Seneca Valley students, clearance guidelines were approved by the school board: Long-term volunteers who expect to be with students without a district employee within reasonable proximity, or volunteers for any overnight activity, shall be required to have an Act 34 Criminal History Report, an Act 151 Child Abuse Clearance, and an FBI [as appropriate] clearance on file at the individual school at which they are volunteering. 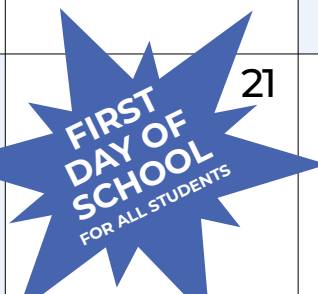

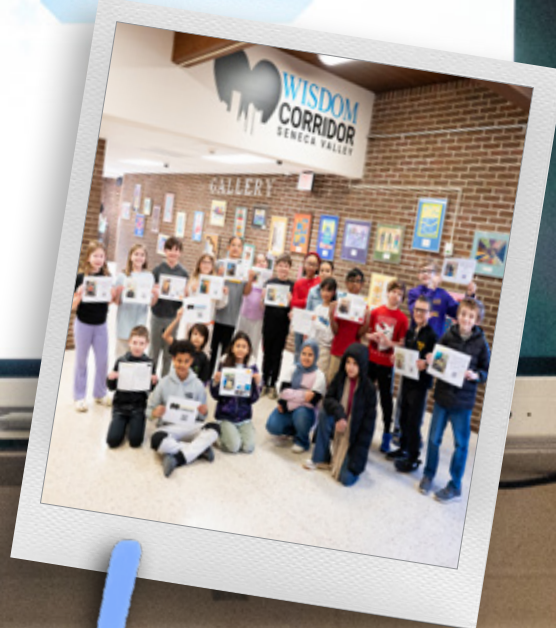

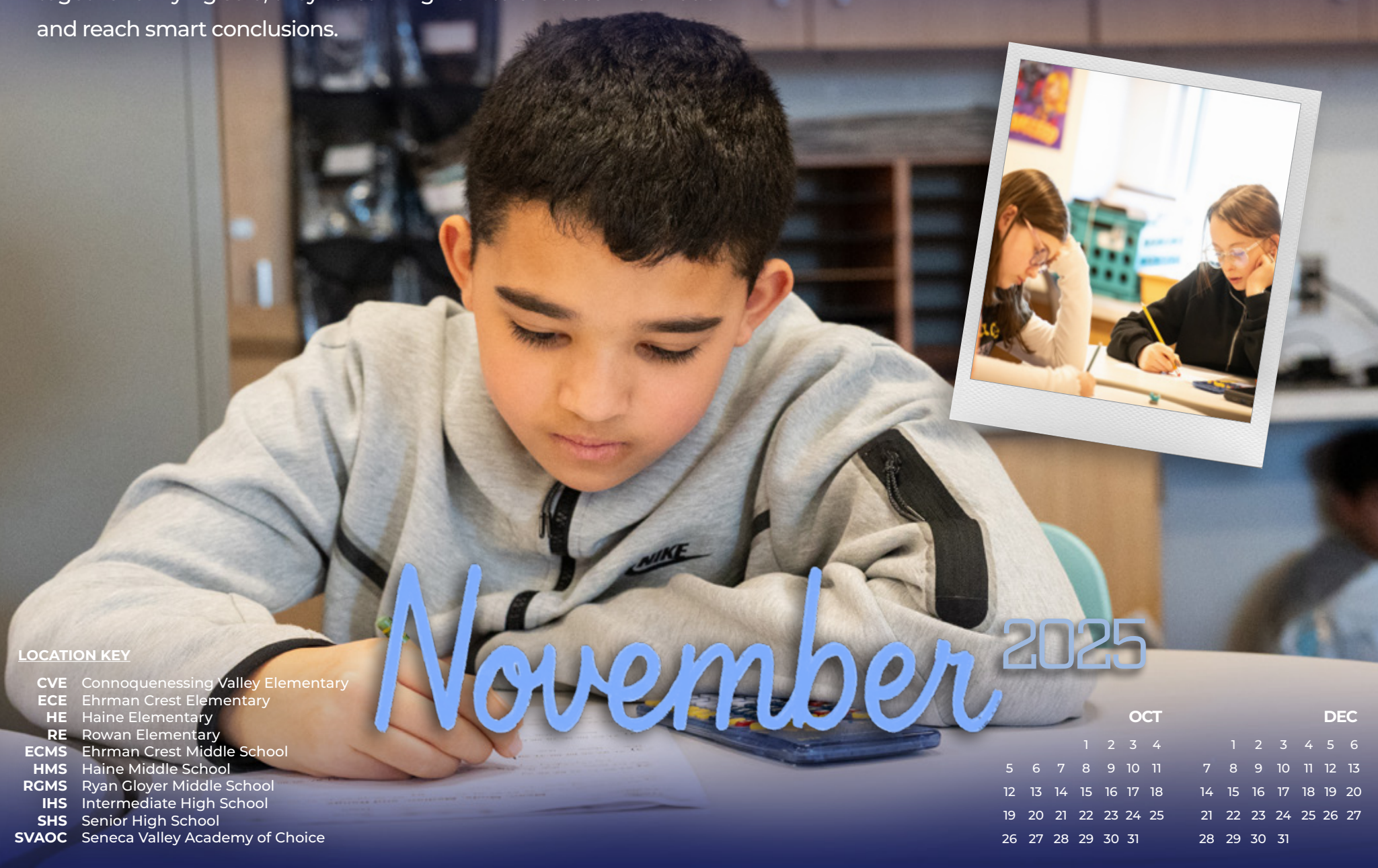
