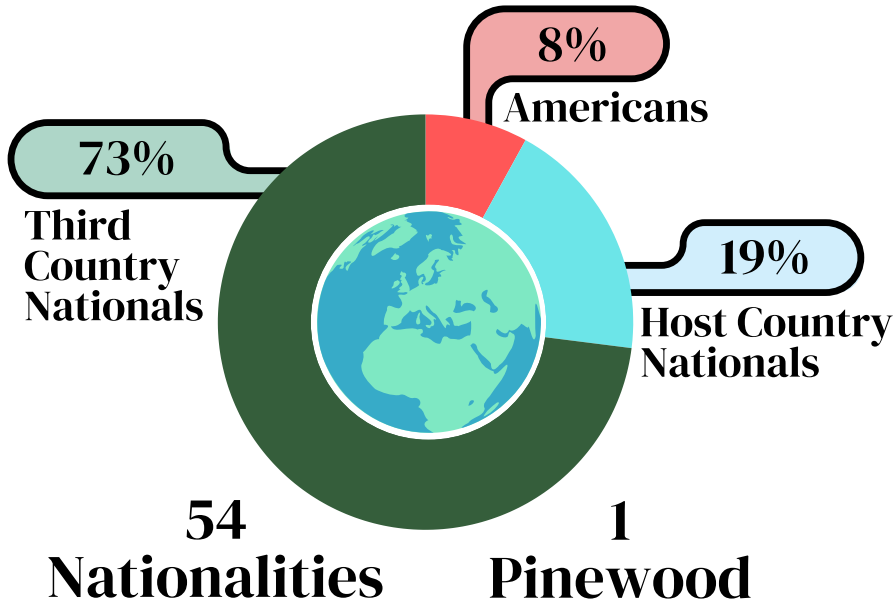




## PINEWOOD STUDENTS

## OUR CURRICULUM

### *Advanced Placement® Curriculum*

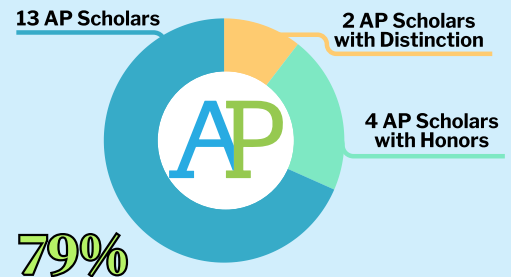
Pinewood's AP program continues to demonstrate impressive growth, reflecting both student ambition and academic rigor. In 2024, the pilot year for AP courses at Pinewood, 22 students sat for 24 AP exams, with 68% earning a score of 3 or higher. By 2025, participation expanded dramatically, as 86 students took 172 exams, marking nearly a fourfold increase in enrollment within just one year.

Success grew alongside participation, with 79% of AP students achieving scores of 3 or higher. In real numbers, this represents an increase from 15 successful students in 2024 to 68 in 2025. These results highlight the dedication of Pinewood's students and teachers and underscore the strength of our AP program in preparing students for the challenges of university and beyond.

### *IB Diploma Programme*

Our school offers a comprehensive IB Curriculum that nurtures well-rounded, globally-minded students prepared for the challenges of higher education and beyond. In the 2025 examinations, our students excelled with an average score of 32 points, with 10% of the students scoring 40 points or higher. Students also exceeded global averages with a 97% pass rate. Our skilled IB educators guide students through a challenging and rewarding academic journey, fostering both personal and academic growth.

### AP Scholars



of Pinewood's AP students achieved a score of 3 or above in the 2025 Exams

In 2025, Pinewood students earned notable College Board distinctions. Thirteen students were recognized as AP Scholars, four as AP Scholars with Honor, and two as AP Scholars with Distinction. The average score across all AP Scholars was 3.36.

Students earning Honor recognition achieved an average score of 3.56, while those with Distinction reached an impressive 3.7. These accomplishments reflect both academic excellence and commitment to high-level learning.

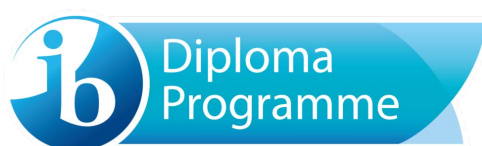

- All AP students are expected to participate in the AP with WE Service program in at least one course.

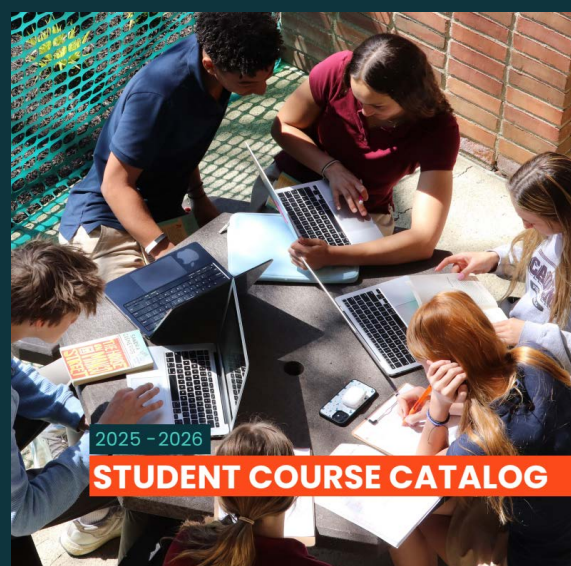


The DP is a 2-year program of study, joint with Anatolia. The extensive list of course offerings can be found [HERE](#).
