

HIGHLAND EXPRESS CHILD CARE PROGRAM (LATCHKEY)



ABSENCE REPORTING



Report a student's absence in one of the following ways:

- App Using your mobile device, download and install the SM Home app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store (or from the links at home.schoolmessenger.com). The first time you use the app, select Sign Up to create your account. Select Attendance then Report an Absence.
- Website Use the SafeArrival website <u>home.schoolmessenger.com</u>. The first time you use the website, select **Sign Up** to create your account. Select **Attendance** then **Report an Absence**.
- Phone Call the toll-free number at 1-855-677-8609 to report an absence using the automated phone system.

These options are available 24 hours/day, 7 days a week. Future absences can be reported at any time. When students are absent due to illness or appointments, please send in any documentation provided by your physician's office (if applicable). If your student will be out for a planned absence of three days or longer, please continue to complete the <u>planned absence form</u> that can be found on the Highland Local School District website under Quick Links on the webpage of your child's school building.

CAR RIDER ARRIVAL/DISMISSAL

Using Two Lanes

As you enter the school parking area, please begin using **TWO lanes** right away. Stay in two lanes through both parking areas. When you loop in front of the school, merge into **one lane** for drop-off and pick-up.

Drop-Off (Arrival) - 8:45 to 8:55 AM

- **Drop-off time:** 8:45–8:55 AM
- Do not arrive before 8:30, as this causes traffic on Ridge Road and blocks the school entrance.
- Drop-off begins at the green "DROP OFF" sign near the sidewalk.
- Stay in your car. Staff will help students exit safely on the **passenger side** along the sidewalk.

Pick-Up (Dismissal) - Begins at 3:20 PM

- **Do not arrive before 3:00**, to avoid blocking Ridge Road and the entrance.
- Students are picked up along the sidewalk in the four-cone loading zone.
- Stay in your vehicle staff will help students get in on the passenger side only.
- Any student not picked up by 3:45 PM will be taken to Latchkey.

Car Rider Tags

- All students receive a car rider tag at Open House.
- Display your car tag on your rearview mirror during pick-up.
- Keep the tag visible until your child is in your car.
- If you don't have your tag, you may be asked for ID and directed to pull aside.
- Need an extra tag? Send a note with your child.

Letting the School Know

- Picking up instead of using the bus?
 - Send a note in your child's green folder to let the teacher and office know.
 Information to include in your note:
 - Student's first and last name
 - Teacher's name
 - Time & reason for leaving early
- Change of plans during the day?
 - Call the school before 2:30 PM to notify us.
- Please do not come in the building during regular dismissal.
- Latest early dismissal is 2:45 PM. After that, students are getting ready to go home.

HAZEL HEALTH

The Highland Local School District continues to partner with Hazel Health to provide telehealth counseling services to students. All students, including those who are insured through private insurance plans and Medicaid, can access free online counseling and therapy. Please note, these services are 100% confidential and will not be provided without guardian consent.

Through the program, your child can work one-on-one with a licensed therapist in weekly video telehealth sessions. The telehealth option is offered to help support the wellbeing of students in a manner that brings less disruption to their school day by not having to leave for appointments and parents not having to miss work.

Students can see one of Hazel Health's therapists who specialize in supporting students who need short-term care and can help with:

- Mood & behavior changes, motivation, grief, loss
- Separation anxiety, worry, fears
- Social skills, bullying, peer & family relationships
- Academic stress
