GRADING POLICIES:

The semester grade is determined by the total points earned in each of the following areas and the number of points corresponds with a letter grade (outlined in the student handbook). The areas of evaluation and their weight toward the grade are as follows:

Summative Grades will account for 60%

The goal for summative assessment is to evaluate student learning at the end of an instructional unit.

Formatives Grade will account for 40%

The goal of formative assessment is to monitor student learning to provide ongoing feedback that can be used to improve as needed.

Missed Work Due to Absences:

It is **the student's** responsibility to obtain the homework assignments, notes & any other pertinent information that is missed during an absence.

Missed work due to an absence: Additional time (up to five school days) and full credit will be allowed for each day of a verifiable and excused absence. Exceptions will be made in unique, deserving situations as determined by the teacher and/or administrator.

There is No Late Work at ACE:

Struggling to Complete Assignment- Communicate this to your teacher. You will be scheduled for Remediation during our ACE Intervention Block

Refusal to Complete Assignment- You will be assigned a Working Period during lunch, CTE or before or after school to complete the assignment. You applied to come to ACE and there is a waiting list. Failure to complete work is not an option.

Employability Rubric:

Soft Skills are an essential part of each CTE Curriculum. ACE has instituted an Employability Rubric (below) which will count as a summative grade. In each program level a summative accountability rubric grade (which will be the same for each level) will be given 4 times in a semester (roughly every 4 weeks).

Statement for Academic Dishonesty:

Academic honesty is expected in all ACE classes. Cheating will not be tolerated. Consequences may include: reduction in grade on the assignment, repeat the assignment, no grade on assignment or others as deemed appropriate. Unit 2: Breaking Roles, Building Futures

- Focus: How social roles and stereotypes affect how we see ourselves
- Readings: Literary Selections from the textbook
- Major Project: Group debate on challenging stereotypes in the workforce

Unit 3: How Much Does the Past Define the Future

- Focus: Solving problems or exploring topics in your CTE program
- Readings: Literary Selections from the textbook
- Major Project: Short research paper on a career-related issue

Unit 4: Seeing Things New: Perspectives and Preparation

- Focus: Analyzing how shifts in societal values, power structures, and personal beliefs shape individual identity and collective experience.
- Readings: Literary Selections from the textbook
- Major Project: Group ethical scenario and reflection

Unit 5: Discovering the Self — Identity & Communication

- Focus: Preparing for life after high school by reflecting on personal identity and communicating effectively through professional interviews and workplace scenarios.
- Reading: Literary Selections from the textbook
- Major Project: Update resume, cover letter, mock interviews

Unit 6: Reflecting on personal growth through CTE and planning future pathways through a multimedia presentation and reflection on hard and soft skills learned.

- Focus: Career skills and self-reflection
- Major Project: “What I’ve Learned” Capstone and LinkedIn Profile

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
