Emergency Management

 - The plan includes emergency procedures guidelines.
 - Contains information specific to different emergencies.
 - The red book is available in all classrooms and through a cell phone app - My-EOP.
- All teachers and staff are trained during August professional development sessions.



Required Safety Drills

IN AN EMERGENCY TAKE ACTION | ADULTS

Drills	Frequency
Secure	One per school year
Hold	One per school year
Lockdown 	Two per school year (one each semester)
Evacuate	One per school year
Shelter-in-place for Hazmat	One per school year
Shelter for Severe Weather	One per school year
Fire Evacuation	<p>Campus - One each month</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • First drill within first ten days of school • Alternate between obstructed & unobstructed.

SECURE! Move everyone indoors and lock outside doors. Increase awareness. Account for students/adults, Business as usual.

LOCKDOWN! Clear hallways, if possible. Lock the door. Turn off the lights. Move out of sight. Maintain silence. Do not open the door.

EVACUATE! Lead and account for students/adults at specified location.

SHELTER! Hazmat and Weather: Lead and account for students/adults.

Tornado | Evacuate to shelter area

Hazmat | Seal the doors and windows

Earthquake | Drop, cover, and hold

Flooding | Move to high ground

FIRE EVACUATION! Lead and account for students/adults. Exit safely and quickly. Know evacuation routes and assembly areas.

HOLD! Hold in your room or area! Hallways need to be kept clear of occupants. Move students into nearest classroom, take accountability of students. Continue to provide instruction as normal. Wait for the All Clear to be given. (Possible reasons for a Hold: fight, injured student or staff being transported by EMS, building search, angry or violent visitor.)

Raptor APP



- All teachers and staff have been trained and have access to the application.
- Principal Saldaña initiates drills and emergency situations.
- The app provides a platform for all staff and teachers to be able to communicate with each other quickly.

Threat Management

- All threats are taken seriously and are investigated.
- Full investigation:
 - Police involvement
 - Collection of evidence
 - Threat assessment
- Code of Student Conduct



Communication

Safety Team

The safety team is informed first to start immediately addressing the situation or start an investigation.

ED of Support

Communicates with district officials to get communication drafted and approved.

Central Division Chief

Division Superintendent reviews communication and send approval for distribution.

Parents & Guardians

Communication will be sent to all parents and guardians via Parent Square.

2. Transitions

- a. Teachers, administrators and staff in the hallway actively monitoring

- a. Teachers monitoring students and walking them out.
- b. Administrators assigned duty spots

- a. Grade level colors shirts

5. Campus Officer

- b. Outside during transitions
