## Department Fine Arts/Special Education Departments Advanced Creative Film Appreciation

**Course Description:** This course is designed to introduce students to viewing movies with a more critical eye. They will explore familiar and unfamiliar films by comparing them based on specific attributes such as genre, production date, narrative technique and culture.

<p><b>UNIT OBJECTIVES (SWBATS):</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students will view movies = with a specific purpose in mind.</li> <li>• Students will compare and contrast movies with similar attributes. Attributes may include, but are not limited to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Film type (animation vs. live action) - Ex: 1955 animated <i>Lady and the Tramp</i> vs 2019 live action <i>Lady and the Tramp</i></li> <li>○ Adaptation (text vs. movie; children’s book adaptation vs. novel adaptation) - Ex: 1988 book <i>Matilda</i> vs. 1996 film <i>Matilda</i></li> <li>○ Production Date (old vs. New) - Ex: 1971 film <i>Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory</i> vs. 2023 <i>Wonka</i> film</li> <li>○ Genre (drama vs. Comedy) - Ex: 2009 film <i>Up</i> vs 2021 film <i>The Mitchells vs. the Machines</i></li> <li>○ Sequels (similarities and differences across versions) - Ex: 1995 film <i>Jumanji</i> vs. 2019 film <i>Jumanji: The Next Level</i></li> <li>○ Narrative technique (fiction vs. nonfiction/documentary) - Ex: 2005 nonfiction film <i>March of the Penguins</i> vs 2005 fictional film <i>Happy Feet</i></li> <li>○ Culture (representations of same vs. different cultures) - Ex: 2021 film <i>Encanto</i> (Colombia) vs. 2012 <i>Brave</i> (Scotland) vs. 2016 film <i>Moana</i> (Polynesia) female coming of age stories</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Students will respond critically to movies and give reasons for their responses.</li> </ul>
<p><b>INSTRUCTIONAL STRATEGIES/ACTIVITIES:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Discuss attribute</li> <li>• Screen movies and/or books</li> <li>• Discuss similarities and differences related to attribute being compared</li> <li>• Develop and share opinion of films with supporting reasons (ex: write/record film reviews)</li> </ul>

**ASSESSMENTS (Diagnostic/Benchmark/Formative/Summative):**

- Discussions
- Film reviews (written or verbal (ex: FlipGrid))

**DIFFERENTIATED INSTRUCTION (Acceleration/Enrichment):**

- Paraprofessional support
- Ensure appropriateness of films/scenes for age and developmental level
- Modification of assignments:
  - Accept various response types (ex: written vs. verbal (FlipGrid))
  - Provide appropriate accommodations based on the student's IEP
