GPA

All courses taken within the regular school day and regular school year carry grade points. Grades for courses in which credit was earned outside the regular school day or outside the regular school year, or high school credit courses taken prior to entering 9th grade shall not be included in the computation of a student's GPA. Eligible courses are classified and weighted as Regular, Honors or Dual Credit, and Advanced Placement (AP) or Pearland Advanced Program (PAP). Grades are converted using the following scale:

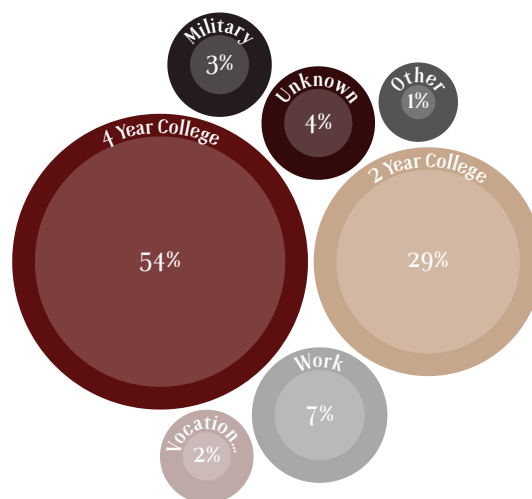
