## PUTTING THE LATEST RESEARCH ON GIRLS INTO PRACTICE

Research lives in our classrooms and our pedagogy, and every Hewitt teacher understands the research on how girls learn best. Our school environment cultivates authentic and supportive student-teacher relationships and provides a variety of resources to support mission-aligned, age-appropriate, and discipline-specific curricular design. This approach ensures that each Hewitt girl is appropriately challenged and engaged in her learning.

Hewitt also partners with several research organizations including the Radical Listening Project in the Steinhardt School of Education, New York University; the Klingenstein Center at Teachers College, Columbia University; and Mine the Gap as we continue to develop new evidence-based best practices for educating girls.

Students thrive when families work in close partnership with our school. From morning coffee talks to evening lectures, Hewitt parents and guardians are invited to learn about the developmental stages of girls and young women and engage with research-informed practices that improve girls' lives and outcomes.



## STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES

### AFTER-SCHOOL (K-4)

Hewitt's robust after-school program invites our students to explore and engage in over 20 different specialized classes, including Chess, Broadway Stars, Cardboard Tech, Treblemakers Choir, Multi-Sports, Mini Chefs, Creative Writing, Martial Arts, Making Movies, Culinary Masterclass, and VEX Robotics.

### STUDENT-LED SUSTAINABILITY

Hewitt's Sustainability Council, Upper School Earth Committee, and Middle School Sustainability Team lead school-wide campaigns to reduce campus waste and promote a sustainable future. In an average school year, student-led efforts include:

- 3500 pounds of leftover food donated to Rescuing Leftover Cuisine
- 750 pounds of paper waste recycled
- 100 pounds of dried markers, used glue sticks, and empty snack wrappers recycled with TerraCycle

## OUR STUDENTS COME FROM ACROSS THE TRI-STATE AREA

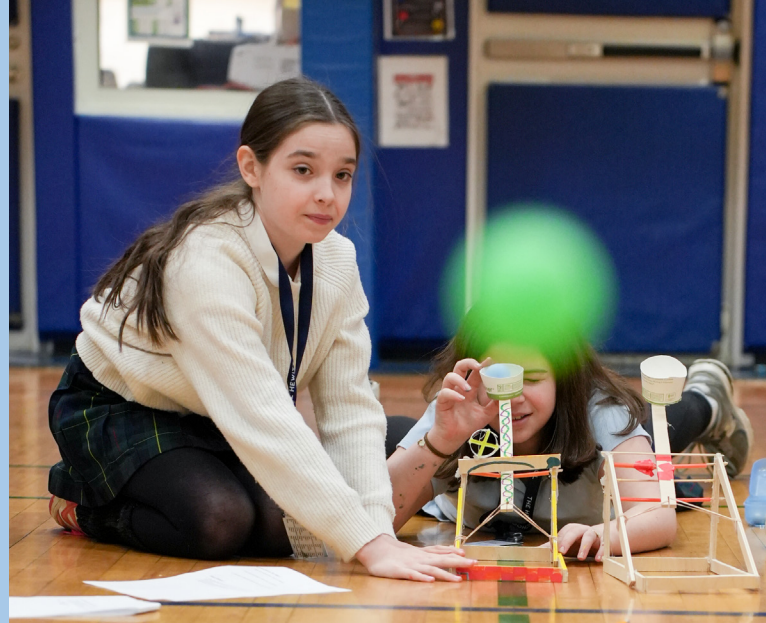

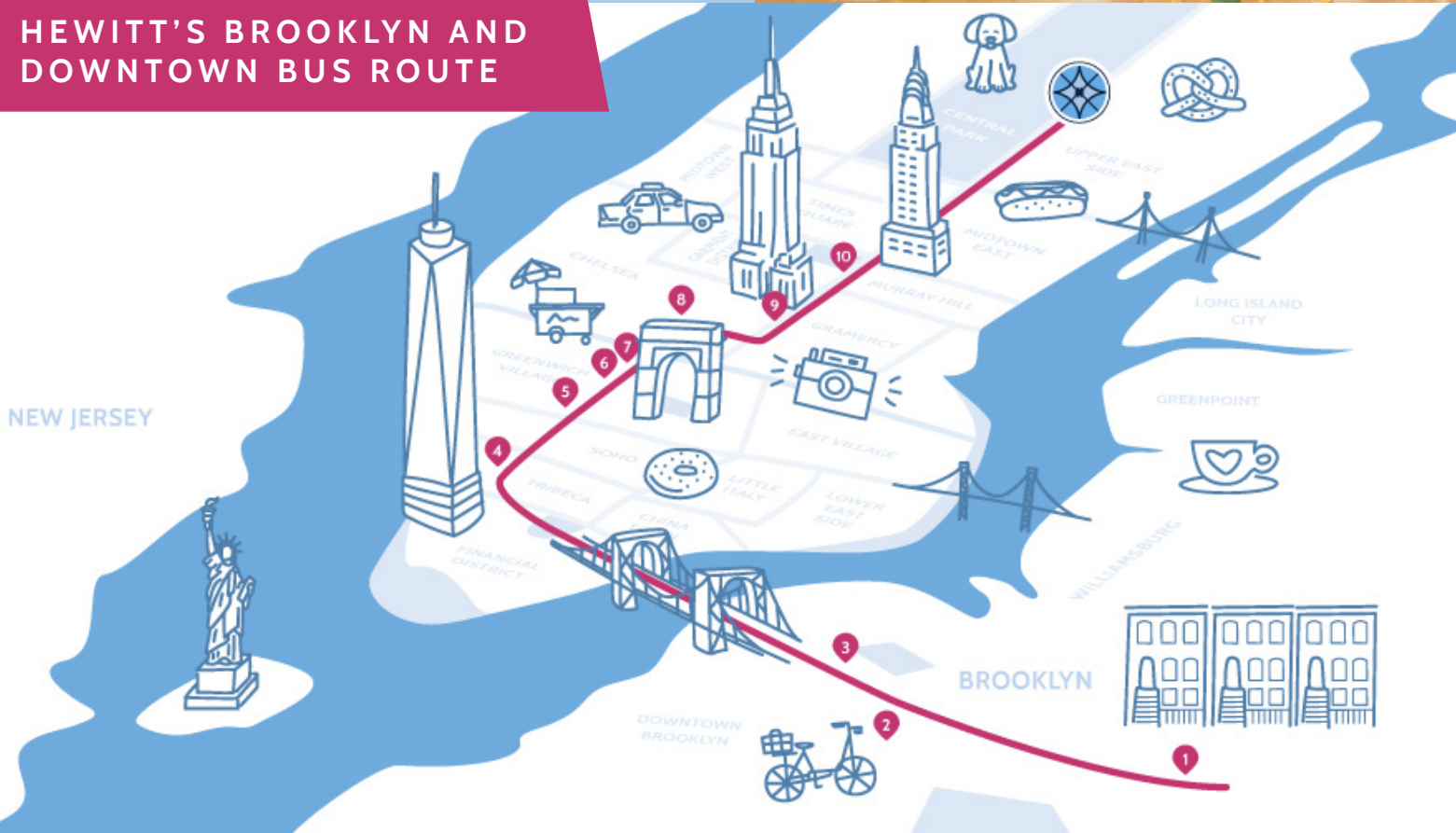
