2025-2026 Bus Routes



Our bus routes are currently all loaded in MY Ride K-12 software. You can access the bus routes via the My Rides K-12 app on your cell phone or by the My Rides k-12 website on your computer. This is a super helpful app as it relates to knowing where your child's bus is in real time on any given day.

Here are the directions to access via the phone app or the website. If you don't know your child's ID number, please call the

school your child attends and they can share the child's ID number (it is the same number as your child's lunch number).


All of the bus routes are also <u>linked here</u> with the start and end times of each run and their streets/roads they service.

go paperless and streamline data collection, forms are now being submitted and processed electronically. This includes forms for updating student information, such as demographics, parent and emergency contacts, medical information, and more. Additional forms give parents the ability to provide their annual consent for things like use of school technology, administration of over-the-counter medication, field trip participation, photo use, school handbooks, and more. In order to access these forms, as well as other educational information, families will need to have a PowerSchool Parent Portal account.

If you already have an account set up and linked to your students, we are asking you to please log into the Parent Portal at http://scarborough.powerschool.com/public, click on the Forms button in the navigation bar, and fill out any incomplete 2025-26 forms.

If you do not have an account, or your account is not linked to one of your students, please consult the step by step instructions linked below.

You will need access keys, unique identifying codes used to validate each parent/student relationship, in order to set up your account. If you do not have these keys, please contact your child's school (access keys were sent to parents of new students via email at time of initial enrollment).

What To Expect When Visiting Our Schools



For the past couple of years, Scarborough Public Schools has been using the Raptor Visitor Management System in all of our schools to strengthen our program of campus safety for students and staff. Part of keeping students and staff safe is knowing who is in our buildings at all times, and the Raptor system allows us to do that. The Raptor system assists in screening visitors, contractors, and volunteers in our schools and provides a safer environment for our students and staff.


What to Expect:

- Upon being allowed through the exterior door of a district building and navigating to the main office as you have always done, all visitors and outside contractors are asked to present a photo ID such as a driver's license.
- Your ID will either be scanned or manually entered into the system by office personnel at the transaction window.
- Once cleared, you will receive a pre-printed badge with your photo on it and where you are going in the building.
- You will then be directed to the appropriate location that you are going to.
- This badge must be worn at all times when in the building. When in the building, you are only approved to go to the specific location requested. You should not go to any other area of the building without returning to the main office for approval first.
- When leaving the building, please be sure to return to the main office and sign out with office personnel.

What does the Raptor System do?

- The Raptor system checks to ensure that registered sex offenders are not entering our school
 campuses without our knowledge. It checks the visitor's name and date of birth for
 comparison with a national database of registered sex offenders. The registered sex offender
 database is the only official database. No other data from the ID is gathered or recorded, and
 the information is not shared with any outside agency.
- The Raptor system will also check for any court issued custodial orders, restraining orders
 and other custom alerts as established by the School District. The safety of our students is
 our highest priority, and the Raptor visitor management system allows us to quickly identify
 those that may present a danger to our students. Thank you in advance for your understanding
 and your support in enhancing the school safety protocols in our district

School Breakfast and Lunch Information



As a general reminder, all breakfast and lunch meals for all students in Scarborough Schools are FREE. All existing students whose parents have an account will be able to order breakfast and lunch using the same procedure as last year, from the Nutrislice app on a device or at the <u>Nutrition Program Menus</u> page (at the top of the page click "Quick links", then go to School Lunch Info for all meal menus).

Parents of Kindergarten and new students to the district will have to make a Nutrislice account through the Nutrislice app or through https://scarboroughschools.nutrislice.com/menu/create-account before they can order breakfast and lunch. Parents will need the child's ID# before they can start the registration process.

For <u>breakfast meals</u> in all of our schools, you can order online on the same day before 6:30 AM, while for <u>lunch meals</u>, you can order online on the same day before 7:30 AM. You can order meals for the day, or set up a weekly or monthly plan for meals to be provided to your children. The menus for all meals for a new month will be posted on the school's website and on the Nutrislice app the last Monday at the end of the previous month.

Middle and High school students do not use a pre-order system; students can select their desired meals at the time of their meal period, with additional a la carte options available for purchase at an extra cost.

Transportation Challenges

Please be aware that there are currently challenges associated with our bussing system that may impact your family's daily routine. Not unlike surrounding school districts, we are struggling to find enough school bus drivers to meet our needs. Please know that we are actively working to address these issues and ensure a smooth and



efficient transportation experience for all our students. Our transportation team is dedicated to minimizing delays and any increases in bus routes, but these may occur from time to time, especially as we adjust bus routes in the first few weeks of school (based on what actual ridership

looks like). We appreciate your patience and understanding as we work through these challenges. For real-time access to your child's route and the specific time to expect the bus on a day to day basis, we encourage you to download the MY Ride app.

Tips for a Successful 2025-2026 School Year

Here are a few tips to assist you as you set forth for the coming school year:

- **Discuss Goals and Expectations:** Have an age-appropriate conversation with your child about what they're looking forward to and what might be challenging this year.
- **Update Contact Info and Emergency Forms**: Ensure your school has your current contact information, emergency contacts, and any medical or allergy info.
- Establish a Smooth Morning Routine: Help your child start the day calmly and on time—this sets the tone for learning and confidence.
- **Practice After-School Routines:** Set expectations for screen time, homework, downtime, and bedtime.
- **Talk About the Day**: Ask open-ended questions like "What was the best part of your day?" to encourage conversation without pressure.
- **Read Communications from the School:** Stay on top of newsletters, teacher emails, and school calendars to avoid surprises.
- Label Belongings: Label lunchboxes, backpacks, water bottles, and jackets to reduce the chance of lost items.
- Foster a Growth Mindset: Encourage effort over perfection, and help your child see mistakes as part of learning.
- Communicate Proactively with Teachers: Establish a positive relationship early with your child's teacher(s) and keep lines of communication open.



- **Encourage Independence:** Support your child in taking ownership of their responsibilities (e.g., packing their bag, checking homework).
- **Get Involved (Whenever Possible):** Volunteer, attend events, or join the PTA, Boosters, or other school supporting organizations—your presence shows your child that school is a priority.
- Monitor Emotional and Social Well-Being: Check in regularly to ensure your child feels safe, supported, and connected.
