

Title HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR'S STATUS: VALEDICTORIAN AND SALUTATORIAN  
Code 4741  
Status Active  
Adopted July 6, 2022

The purposes of the weighting of grades are to encourage students to take more challenging courses and to differentiate those students who have academically achieved at the highest levels in order to recognize their individual achievements.

A weighted grade point average will be calculated by September of the twelfth grade and reported on each student's transcript for college admission purposes. Courses are weighted as follows:

Advanced Placement Courses & Dual Enrollment Courses:	1.12
Honors Level Courses:	1.07
Regents Level Courses:	1.00

Among regional and state high schools, grade-weighting policies vary widely. Thus, high school level transfer students' transcripts shall be reviewed and evaluated by the building principal who will "unweight" the grades, if it is deemed that the sending school practiced grade weighting. The principal will then re-weight the grades according to the Glen Cove High School system of weighting.

The Valedictorian and Salutatorian will be determined by the highest weighted grade ranks each year, based upon six semesters of grades. Only students who have attended Glen Cove High School for five consecutive semesters will be considered for these designations.

College courses taken outside the high school must be from an accredited college or university. The course information will not be listed on the transcript, nor will it be counted toward the student's GPA or class ranking; however, if an official copy of the college transcript is sent to the high school it will be included with college applications. Students are responsible to arrange for a sealed, official transcript to be sent directly to the college of acceptance.

These courses will be taken at no cost to the district and strictly on a voluntary basis. The student is responsible for requesting an official transcript to be sent to the high school guidance department from the college/university issuing credit.

Online courses offered directly by Glen Cove High School, such as the Apex Online Credit Recovery courses, will be listed on the official Glen Cove High School transcript, with the respective course title weighted accordingly and counted toward the student's GPA.

This policy will be communicated to all high school students each year by their guidance counselors. The policy will also appear in the Glen Cove High School Course Manual, which is published and distributed to every student each year.
