 - (B) families are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education at school;
 - (C) families are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child; and
 - (D) other activities are carried out, such as those described in Section 1116 of the ESSA.

Description of how the school will implement required school parent and family engagement policy components:

ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING

Clyde Riggs Elementary will take the following actions to conduct an annual meeting, at a convenient time, and encourage and invite all families of participating children to attend to inform them about the school's Title I program, the nature of the Title I program, the families' requirements, the school parent and family engagement policy, the school-wide plan, and the school-parent compact.

- The annual Title 1 meeting will be held with an alternate meeting time to accommodate the schedules of our families.
- Parents will be informed of the requirements of a Title 1 school as well as the families' rights to be involved as well as the complaint procedure.
- Family engagement opportunities for the year will be discussed. The school-wide compact will be sent and includes the dates of upcoming family engagement opportunities.

COMMUNICATIONS

Clyde Riggs Elementary will take the following actions to provide families of participating children the following:

- Timely information about the Title I programs
- Flexible number of meetings, such as meetings in the morning or evening related to parent and family engagement.
- Information related to the school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities, is sent to the families of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request and, to the extent practicable, in a language the families can understand:

- Flyers are sent home with ample notice of upcoming family engagement opportunities along with reminders the day before an event.
- Family engagement opportunities will be put on the school marquee.

RESERVATION OF FUNDS

- Each family will complete a parent interest survey at our annual parent meeting in the fall. This survey gives families an opportunity to express areas in which monies should be spent in regard to parent and family engagement.

COORDINATION OF SERVICES

Clyde Riggs Elementary will, to the extent feasible and appropriate, coordinate and integrate parent and family engagement programs and activities with other Federal, State, and local programs, including public preschool programs, and conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support families in more fully participating in the education of their children by:

- Clyde Riggs partners with the Rotary Club of Portland to provide multiple bicycles to our students during the year.
- Clyde Riggs partners with local banks to discuss with students services offered at their respective banks.
- Clyde Riggs partners with local churches to provide food packs that go home with students on Friday.
- Christmas assistance is provided to our families by various churches and businesses.

BUILDING CAPACITY OF SCHOOL STAFF

Clyde Riggs Elementary will provide training to educate teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of families, in the value and utility of contributions of families, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with families as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between families and the school by:

- The Title 1 staff participates in professional developments throughout the year that specifically address ways that we can better work with our families as equal partners.
- Parents are included in decision making about family engagement activities.
- Parents are also invited to be a part of our PTO.

Clyde Riggs Elementary will provide other reasonable support for parent and family engagement activities under Section 1116 as families may request by:

- Continue to include parents on school and system-wide planning committees.
- Continue to gather information from parents through questionnaires and surveys.
- Provide an opportunity for parents to ask questions, share concerns, and offer suggestions at meetings.
- Encourage parents to assist with revisions of policies as needed.
