

### FAFSA: New High School **Graduation Requirement**

#### What is the new state law?

Starting with the class of 2025, Nebraska law requires all public high school students to complete and submit a FAFSA (or actively opt out) as a graduation requirement. This is known as Universal FAFSA.

### Why does this law exist?

Universal FAFSA ensures that all Nebraska seniors complete the FAFSA, unlocking federal financial aid and encouraging them to consider further education beyond high school.

#### Why is completing the FAFSA a graduation requirement?

Completing the FAFSA informs students about their financial aid options, enabling them to make smarter decisions about their postsecondary education.

#### How will this benefit Nebraska students?

In 2022, half of Nebraska graduates didn't file the FAFSA, missing out on an estimated \$23 million in aid. This initiative helps reach the goal of 70% of Nebraskans earning a diploma, degree, or industry credential by 2030.

### What if I choose not to complete the FAFSA?

For parents that choose not to complete the FAFSA, there will be an opt out form that will be available to families. The school will share this form with families in December after the FAFSA has been made available.

## Steps

### How to Create a Federal Student Aid Account (FSA ID)

Before you complete the FAFSA, you and the parent(s) who provided the most financial support will need to create FSA IDs. They must be verified by the Social Security Administration, which can take up to 3 days.

- 1. Go to studentaid.gov and click on Create Account.
- 2. Enter personal information.
- · Legal name, date of birth, Social Security Number.
- · Email address, mailing address, mobile phone number.
- · Both you and a parent will need individual email accounts. Don't use a high school email account.
- 3. Answer challenge questions. Select answers that are easy to remember and won't change over time.
- 4. Enter validation codes to confirm your mobile number and email, or set up the Authenticator App.
- 5. Save your information.
