

Board of Education News

The Blair Community Schools Board of Education met on Monday, August 11th. During the meeting, Dr. Gilson provided an update on storm damage sustained across the district from the severe weather on August 8th. All school buildings experienced some level of damage, with the most significant impact at Blair High School and Otte Middle School. These buildings saw roof damage and displaced HVAC units that required immediate attention.

Thanks to the dedication of our staff and the strong support of our community partners, all buildings were restored to safe, usable condition prior to the first day of school. Repairs are ongoing. A special note of gratitude goes to McKinnis Roofing, whose quick response and expert work played a key role in ensuring our schools were ready to welcome students back on time. McKinnis has long been a trusted partner to Blair Community Schools, and their commitment to our community during this time of need is greatly appreciated.

The Board also discussed district spending authority, a topic of increasing importance due to new state regulations that have placed additional restraints on school district budgets. In light of these challenges, the Blair BOE considered an increase to spending authority. A special meeting was held on August 25th to further address this issue. While the originally requested 6% increase was not approved, the Board did approve a 3% increase in spending authority. This decision will provide the district with some additional flexibility while maintaining fiscal responsibility.

The Board remains committed to maintaining safe facilities, being good stewards of district resources, and ensuring that the needs of students and staff continue to be met.

Mr. Gutschow Recognized with the Foundation Golden Bear Paw Award




