## How Can Parents and Guardians Support Their Children in School?

**Communicate** – stay informed and respond to communications from the school

**Be an Example** – show your child that education is important by attending parent conferences and other school events

**Volunteer** – if you can, help at your child's school and/or with extracurricular activities

**Learn** – ask how to help your child with classwork, homework, and future education plans

**Get Involved** – join parent/teacher organizations, school improvement teams, and other parent committees

**Be Active Within the Community** – participate in activities with other families, visit the public library, or find other ways to get involved in your neighborhood
