### SCHOOL PROFILE

Los Alamitos High School (LAHS) is the only comprehensive high school in the Los Alamitos Unified School District. The school serves the communities of Los Alamitos, Seal Beach, Rossmoor, Surfside, and geographically adjacent areas in the cities of Long Beach and Cypress. The student learning outcomes that Los Alamitos High School works to prepare students to be:

- Academic Achievers
- Complex Thinkers
- Productive Citizens
- Self-Directed Learners

These four graduation goals are the cornerstones of this three-time national Blue Ribbon High School and four-time California Distinguished School. In 2025, Los Alamitos High School received a six-year WASC clear accreditation.

### GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must complete 220 credits for graduation. Each class is given 5 units of credit if passed with a grade of “D” or above. Classes meet for 55 minutes per day, 5 days a week, and 180 days per year. In most cases, students are limited to taking six classes per day.

**GRADING AND CLASS RANKING**

Grading periods at Los Alamitos High School follow a semester system, and the cumulative GPA is calculated on a 4.0 grade point scale. AP and select honors classes recognized by the University of California are weighted on a 5.0 grade point scale. Although we do not provide a precise rank for a student, a decile or percentile rank from the top is calculated based on an overall weighted grade point average. For the Class of 2025, there were 756 graduates, of whom 251 earned an Academic Weighted GPA of 3.85 or higher, and 3 students received a Certificate of Completion.

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## ACADEMIC HONORS

**Academic Honors:** Students who excel in a rigorous academic program are awarded Academic Honors, which is the school's highest honor at graduation. Eligibility to earn Academic Honors at graduation will first be determined during the senior's second semester, and students must meet the UC/CSU 'a-g' requirements and earn a total academic GPA (no PE) of 3.85. 251 seniors in the Class of 2025 were awarded Academic Honors.

**Gold Seal Bearer:** Students who have been a member of the California Scholarship Federation (CSF) at least four semesters during grades 10 through 12, including one semester in their senior year, are awarded Gold Seal Bearer status at graduation. A gold seal is attached to the student's diploma and notation of this honor is made on the student's permanent transcript. 80 seniors with the Class of 2025 earned this distinction.

**Seal of Biliteracy:** Students who complete California state requirements for the Seal of Biliteracy are awarded this honor with a gold seal on their diploma. Students must show high proficiency in two or more languages. 365 seniors with the Class of 2025 earned this honor.

**National Honor Society:** Membership in the National Honor Society is both an honor and a responsibility. Seniors who maintain a cumulative weighted GPA of 3.8 or higher and have two faculty members attest to their citizenship, service, leadership and work habits may be elected to NHS. Members are expected to continue to demonstrate the qualities of scholarship, service, leadership and character for their senior year. 78 seniors from the Class of 2025 earned a gold NHS sash for their service.

**CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAMS:** The diverse co-curricular programs at Los Alamitos High School enriches student's opportunities for leadership and cooperation, as well as enhances the development of special talents. With over 80% of students participating in academic or social clubs, athletics, student government, performance groups, and/or service clubs, it is no surprise that their involvement has led to success in a variety of arenas including, but not limited to: regional, state, and national championships in athletics, yell/song/cheer, band, music, speech and debate, Academic Decathlon, and Science Olympiad. The community-minded students of Los Alamitos High School comprise one of the largest Rotary-Interact Service Clubs in Southern California; and Griffins With A Mission (GWAM), our human relations program, serves as a model in the county. Students also serve through California Scholarship Federation (CSF) and the National Honor Society (NHS). 203 graduates of 2025 earned a community service cord for their service. 26.9% of 2025 graduates completed over 100 hours of service to the school and community. Los Alamitos High School is proud to graduate students who have experienced a challenging academic program, a commitment to excellence and school involvement, and a personal sense of responsibility and community. Graduates of Los Alamitos High School are prepared for the challenges of college and career; they know the pride of accomplishment and the value of contribution.
