



### What is Title I?

- Title I ensures that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, *Proficiency* on challenging State academic achievement standards / academic assessments. **Ator Elementary operates a schoolwide program!**

### What does it mean for Ator to be Title I Schoolwide?

- Funds are spent on **all** children to raise academic achievement
- Funds provide additional assistance for **all** students who experience difficulties in meeting the state's performance targets.

### What data sources were used to determine Ator's eligibility for Title I assistance?

- District periodic assessments such as Amira Learning, Classroom grade-level assessments, and report card data;
- State OSTP test results.
- Student-teacher ratios
- Teacher and parent surveys
- Transportation data
- Safety data
- Civil Rights data
- Student data, such as attendance, suspensions, tardiness, multicultural, after-school tutoring, and special education data.

### What are the goals for Ator's Title I school-wide program?

- Increase Parental Involvement for all students
- Raise the achievement level of all students
- Narrow the gap between the highest and lowest achieving students in all populations.

### What are Ator Teachers doing to ensure Title I students receive quality interventions and support?

- Teachers participate in training that focuses on standards-driven instruction, scientifically research-based instructional strategies, assessment-informed decision-making, and grade-level planning focused on continuity and student-centered instruction.
- Teachers develop new strategies to address small group instruction needs using assessment data to create flexible skill groups for instruction.
- Create new opportunities and means of parent/family engagement and strengthen the home-school connection as partners in our student's education.
- Effectively maximize the current student learning time.

**What can we do at home to support our students?**

- Help develop positive attitudes about school.
- Be willing and enthusiastic partners in the development of achievement goals
- Assist students with improving their math and reading skills, complete homework, and set educational goals.

**What does my child need to do?**

- Create personal learning goals to develop stronger motivation for academic success.
- Internalize the concept of Respect for Self, Others, and Surroundings.
- Increase grade level proficiency in reading/language arts and mathematics.
