IMPORTANT DISTRICT NOTICES

Student Directory Information

Student directory information is considered "public" under state and federal laws. Unless parents give specific instructions to the contrary, schools must release directory information to anyone who requests it.

Public directory information includes: name; photograph; information provided by the student for inclusion in school-approved publications; participation in officially recognized activities and sports; weight and height of members of athletic teams; names and pictures of students participating in or attending extra-curricular activities, school events, and HS league activities/events: major field of study; dates of attendance; grade level; enrollment status (i.e., full-time or part-time); degrees, honors and awards received; and previous educational agency or institution attended.

If you do not wish for this information to be given out about your child, send written notification including: name of the student and/or parent, if applicable; home address; school presently attended by student; parent's legal relationship to student, if applicable; and specific categories of directory information to be made not public without the parent's or eligible student's prior written consent, which shall only be applicable for that school year. Notification should be sent to: Restrict Directory Data, White Bear Lake Area Schools, 2399 Cedar Ave., WBL, MN 55110, no later than Friday, Oct. 10, 2025.

Release of 11th/12th Grade Data to Military Recruiters

Federal law requires high schools to provide military recruiting officers access to public directory data (above) and the names, addresses and home phone numbers of all 11th and 12th grade students. Parents have a right to refuse release of this data by sending written notification to: Refuse Release to Military Recruiters, White Bear Lake Area Schools, 2399 Cedar Ave., WBL, MN 55110, no later than Friday, Oct. 10, 2025.

Educational Benefits Discounts

We are a part of Minnesota's Free School Meals Program, which means that all students can get one breakfast and one lunch free of charge each day at school for the upcoming school year. Even with this free meal benefit being available to all, it is still very important that families fill out the Application for Educational Benefits because children may qualify for other benefits such as: reduced sports/activity fees, reduced internet access and utility bills, reduced AP test registration and college application fees, reduced drivers training and more! Building Our Future Update

While most of the facilities projects approved by the community in 2019 are now complete, final-stage construction continues at two buildings: Central Middle School and Sunrise

Central Middle School students, who have already been enjoying the new gymnasium added during Phase 1 last summer, will soon benefit from this summer's Phase 2 upgrades. These include an expanded cafeteria, a new Learning Commons, and the transformation of former District Center areas back into academic spaces, adding valuable square footage to the school.

Families and community members are invited to check out the completed construction projects at Central Middle School by joining us for a Community Open House event that will take place during Homecoming week, from 4:30-6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, September 24. Attendees will have an opportunity to check out the gymnasium addition and the building's renovated spaces — including the expanded cafeteria, new Learning Commons and renovations made to the former District Center areas to return them to middle school spaces.

Meanwhile, District Services Center offices have fully settled into their new home at Sunrise Park, following the move during the 2024-25 school year. Since spring 2025, School Board meetings have taken place in the Community Room boardroom at Sunrise. Most recently, the district's Senior Program transitioned to Sunrise Park, following a celebratory farewell picnic at Normandy Park.

Construction is also underway to prepare Sunrise Park to house the Early Childhood Center and Transition Education Center, with programming set to begin in the new space in Fall 2026.
