### SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

White Bear Lake Area High School: A Community's Pride and a Model of Student Success

There's a special kind of energy that fills the halls of White Bear Lake Area High School — an unmistakable sense of pride and purpose that's easy to spot, even for those just passing through. Guests touring the recently completed campus often express awe at the state-of-the-art design, and their admiration speaks volumes. It's a visible reminder of the community's support and foresight in passing the Building Our Future bond referendum in 2019. Thanks to that investment, the high school now stands as a testament to thoughtful planning, innovation, and opportunity.

That excellence has not gone unnoticed. The White Bear Lake Area High School construction project was recently named one of the Top Projects of 2024 by Finance & Commerce, a publication that highlights the best in development and design. The building's architecture and function-forward layout are not just aesthetically impressive — they're fostering a culture of collaboration, connection, and student empowerment.

But the impact of this transformation goes far beyond the building itself.

Inside these walls, students are thriving. Recent data shows that White Bear students took 828 Advanced Placement (AP) tests this past school year, with 79% of those earning scores of 3 or higher — the benchmark at which many colleges award credit. That academic momentum continues through a variety of college-level programs. Students are accumulating college credits through AP courses, concurrent enrollment, Project Lead the Way and Post-Secondary Enrollment Options. In fact, the total value of college credits earned by White Bear students while still in high school last year approached \$3 million — a remarkable return on investment for families and a head start for students.

White Bear Lake Area High School is also preparing students for life with hands-on, real-world experience. Career Pathway programs span nine key industries — from automotive and construction to health and wellness, education, IT and more — and offer students the chance to graduate with both professional certifications and a clear sense of direction. Through an extensive list of extracurricular activities, students are allowed to find their passion and hone the skills of the grit and determination.

Graduates are showing very publicly just how far preparation can take them. This spring, White Bear alumnus Joel Reichow made headlines by winning Grandma's Marathon with a time of 2:11:58, becoming the first athlete to win both the full and half marathon events in Duluth's storied race history. His win was celebrated not only for the feat itself, but also for the clear connection to his roots — from mentions of his high school coach's influence to the familiar orange and black of his race-day gear.

Meanwhile, other Bears are breaking into the big leagues — literally. Nolan Roed, a recent White Bear graduate and captain of the 2023-24 Boys' Hockey Team, was signed by the National Hockey League's Colorado Avalanche. Another alumnus, Derrick Smith, who graduated in 2022, has had a standout career as a pitcher at North Carolina State and was drafted by Major League Baseball's Colorado Rockies.

All of this adds up to something that the White Bear Lake Area Schools community can be truly proud of. From rigorous academics to activities and career-readiness, White Bear students are stepping into the world with confidence, preparation, and Bear pride — and it's clear the best is yet to come.

#### District Recognized for Farm to School initiative

ISD624 was recognized as a Bronze Berry Honoree in the 2025 Minnesota Grown Cream of the Crop Awards for Farm to School and Early Care, which recognizes K-12 school districts, early care centers, and family day cares that go above and beyond to promote and serve foods grown and raised by Minnesota farmers and producers.

"This recognition for White Bear Lake Area Schools is a testament to our Nutrition Services team's dedication to providing students with healthy, locally sourced meals while also supporting Minnesota's agricultural economy," said Assistant Superintendent for Finance and Operations Tim Wald. "Our participation in programs like these helps to build stronger connections between local farms, classrooms, and our community."

#### **Building Our Future Update**

While most of the facilities projects approved by the community in 2019 are now complete, final-stage construction continues at two buildings: Central Middle School and Sunrise Park.

Central Middle School students, who have already been enjoying the new gymnasium added during Phase 1 last summer, will soon benefit from this summer's Phase 2 upgrades. These include an expanded cafeteria, a new Learning Commons, and the transformation of former District Center areas back into academic spaces, adding valuable square footage to the school.

Community members are invited to check out the completed construction projects at Central Middle School by joining us for a Community Open House event that will take place during Homecoming week, from 4:30-6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, September 24.

Meanwhile, District Services Center offices have fully settled into their new home at Sunrise Park, following the move during the 2024-25 school year. Since spring 2025, School Board meetings have taken place in the Community Room boardroom at Sunrise. Most recently, the district's Senior Program transitioned to Sunrise Park, following a celebratory farewell picnic at Normandy Park.



Construction is also underway to prepare Sunrise Park to house the Early Childhood Center and Transition Education Center, with programming set to begin in the new space in Fall 2026.
