
#### SAFETY PROCEDURES FOR WSISD ATHLETIC EVENTS




To enhance safety at athletic events, WSISD implements the following procedures in all athletic facilities:

- All Brewer Middle School students and younger must be accompanied by a parent/guardian at both BHS and BMS games. Any student who is not accompanied by a parent/guardian who will be responsible for the student will not be allowed entry.
- BHS students must provide a student ID to enter, and athletes are required to show their Athletic Pass. If the student does not have an ID, they may enter with a parent/guardian who will be responsible for the student. Any student without the proper identification will not be permitted entry. Students are not permitted to bring backpacks into the facility.
- A clear bag policy is implemented in all Brewer High School and Brewer Middle School athletic facilities and the BHS auditorium.
- All fans are required to pass through metal detectors.

## ANNUAL CONSENT FORM FOR ROUTINE STUDENT HEALTH SERVICES

Texas Senate Bill 12, a new law, requires school districts to receive annual consent so students can receive routine, school-based physical and mental health-related services from qualified school staff, including nurses, athletic trainers, counselors, and other health professionals.

The Annual Consent Form for Routine Student Health Services must be completed for your student(s) to continue receiving these services. Access the form through your <u>Skyward Family Access account</u>, and click Online Forms on the left.

#### WSISD TO PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH PREVENTION EDUCATION FOR STUDENT SAFETY THROUGH PLAY IT SAFE PROGRAM

As required by law, WSISD schools will provide age-appropriate curriculum for all students in the areas of Child Abuse Prevention, Domestic Violence, and Family Violence through the Play It Safe program. To learn more about the curriculum, an evidence-based prevention and personal safety program of The Women's Center of Tarrant County, visit the link.

Each school will communicate the date of the student presentation in advance. Families completed an opt-in/out form with the new student registration or returning student verification.
