Evaluation:	Each January, Washington Elementary will distribute Title I, Part A Parent Surveys to obtain feedback from parents on the content and effectiveness of our Parent & Family Engagement Policy and the Home-School Compact. Responses will be utilized during Home-School Compact and PFE meetings to evaluate and revise both documents for the following school year.
