

Breakfast in the Classroom (BIC)

Where do leftovers and waste go?

Kits are provided that include small blue, green, and black bins and the respective signage that stays in your classroom. The kit stacks up neatly while not in use.

Each service day, 3 brown paper bags are provided to be used inside each blue, green and black small classroom BIC bins.



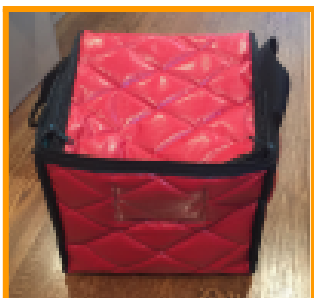
Waste Sorting Training:

P Waste Sorting ...

Unopened milk and leftover food is returned in the thermal bag to the kitchen.

Each service day, empty milk jugs are provided. Leftover milk is poured into the excess milk jug.

Bags are then taken out to the hallway and put into the appropriate waste bin.



Assign student roles to leftovers or each type of waste that gets placed in hallway waste stations.

COMPOST CAPTAIN
Collects compostables in brown bag.

LANDFILL LEADER
Collects trash in brown bag.

LEFTOVER LIBERATOR
Collects sealed leftover food items and whole fruit in plastic bag and puts into thermal bag.

RECYCLING RANGER
Collects recyclables in brown bag.

MILK MARVEL
Walks around the room having students pour milk into jug, then puts jug into thermal bag.
