I-Zone Spotlight:

Fort Lauderdale Zone:

Referendum 2:

The School Board of Broward County (SBBC) is proposing an amendment to the Broward County Charter, which will be on the November 5, 2024, ballot. On the ballot, this amendment will be titled "Referendum 2," and it aims to give the Broward County Office of the Inspector General the authority to independently investigate matters related to SBBC operations.

The amendment proposes expanding the BCOIG's role to include the investigation, audit, and review of SBBC operations. The BCOIG would be empowered to investigate potential issues such as misconduct, gross mismanagement, waste, and fraud. This measure will appear on the ballot as "Referendum 2."

Ballot Language

"Amends the Broward County Charter to allow the Broward County Inspector General to provide inspector general services to The School Board of Broward County and the constitutional officers of Broward County if the applicable entity (The School Board or the constitutional officer) contracts with the Broward County Office of Inspector General and with Broward County regarding such inspector general services."

If voters approve the amendment, the BCOIG will establish a specialized branch dedicated to

SBBC oversight. This branch will include two supervisors, an attorney, three auditors/agents, a manager and an administrative assistant. This special BCOIG branch will cost the District around \$1.2 million annually. BCOIG will have the authority to subpoena witnesses, require documents, and audit BCPS operations and contracts. If the amendment does not pass, the current oversight of SBBC will remain with existing agencies, such as the State Attorney's Office, the Commission on Ethics, and SBBC's own Audit Department. The BCOIG's role will not be expanded to include SBBC operations.

The Broward County Office of Inspector General (OIG) was established in 2010 to provide independent oversight within Broward County and its municipalities. This amendment aims to extend the OIG's oversight capabilities to include the School Board of Broward County, following recommendations for impartial and effective investigations into government operations.

Several members shared that there are concerns regarding the funding source for the anticipated cost of 1.2 million dollars as it was mentioned that it would be covered by internal funds. The Central members would like clarification of what specific internal funding would be impacted. It was also requested that feedback be taken to the board regarding the lack of push for sharing this information out to stakeholders as compared to requests to promote the referendum to voters in previous years. There is a marked reduced level of promotion/information shared comparatively. The Central Advisory would like to officially request an increase in awareness promoted by the District including but not limited to districtwide Parent Link emails, calls, and text messages.

Ballot Measure on Expanding Oversight for the School Board of Broward County November 5, 2024

Overview:

The School Board of Broward County (SBBC) is proposing an amendment to the Broward County Charter, which will be on the November 5, 2024, ballot. On the ballot, this amendment will be titled "Referendum 2," and it aims to give the Broward County Office of the Inspector General the authority to independently investigate matters related to SBBC operations.

What's on the Ballot?

Voters will decide whether to expand the BCOIG's role to include SBBC oversight. The amendment would empower the BCOIG to investigate, audit, and review SBBC operations.

Ballot Language

"Amends the Broward County Charter to allow the Broward County Inspector General to provide inspector general services to The School Board of Broward County and the constitutional officers of Broward County if the applicable entity (The School Board or the constitutional officer) contracts with the Broward County Office of Inspector General and with Broward County regarding such inspector general services."

Key Points if Passed:

- **New Responsibilities:** Creation of a BCOIG branch focused on SBBC, with two supervisors, an attorney, three auditors/agents, a manager, and an administrative assistant.
- **Cost:** This special BCOIG branch will cost the District around \$1.2 million annually.
- **Powers:** The BCOIG will have the authority to subpoena witnesses, require documents, audit operations, and report on misconduct and mismanagement of the SBBC.

If Not Passed:

Oversight of SBBC will remain with existing agencies, such as the State Attorney's Office, the Commission on Ethics and SBBC's Audit Department.

Background:

- The OIG was established in 2010 for independent oversight within Broward County.
- The proposed amendment aims to extend this oversight to SBBC, based on recommendations for impartial investigations.

District Advisory: Next meeting will be DAC General Meeting on Wednesday, November 6, 2024 at 6:15 pm at Plantation Middle School.

Motion regarding students with Diabetes. There is consensus by Central Area to support the North Area motion as below:

We move that Broward County Public Schools automatically include a provision in all 504 plans for students with Type 1 diabetes, allowing the use of cell phones for direct communication between parents and students. This provision is essential for the timely management of blood sugar levels, particularly in light of recent cell phone policy changes that have hindered parent-student communication. Given the life-threatening nature of Type 1 diabetes and the current challenges in school nursing coverage and diabetes management knowledge, this motion is necessary to ensure the safety and well-being of students with this condition.

Facilities Task Force: This committee did not meet due to the storm. Upcoming conversations includes the costs related to moving students from William Dandy to the Arther Ashe campus. This response is pending from the District.

There is consensus by Central Area to support the Facilities Task Force motion as below:

Whereas the steering committee is defined as a team of BCPS senior staff and community stakeholders to guide the creation of the capital planning framework, align to the strategic plan, manage cost, and review policies

We recommend the school board formally adopt the AECOM framework and adopt a resolution establishing the Steering Committee as a committee reporting directly to the School Board.
