



Student Population

The Bolles School is an independent, co-educational day and boarding school founded in 1933. One of the most ethnically and religiously diverse independent schools in the Southeast, Bolles currently enrolls 1,800 students in Pre-K through Grade 12 on four separate campuses.

Bolles actively seeks students who represent diverse backgrounds ethnically, culturally, religiously and socio-economically. In fact, Bolles students come from 74 countries and speak 25 languages. The boarding program at Bolles has the capacity for 90 students and currently enrolls students from 14 U.S. states and 40 countries and territories. For 2025-26, the School awarded more than 5.5 million in need-based financial aid to 302 students, not including faculty tuition discounts.

Global Learning and Engagement

The Pre-K through Grade 12 Global Learning curriculum uses an interdisciplinary approach to prepare students for an interconnected and multicultural world. Programming empowers students to recognize diverse perspectives, communicate ideas, and work alongside people of varying cultural, religious and linguistic backgrounds. Outside of the classroom, students can participate in numerous clubs and activities with a global focus. Students also have the opportunity to study abroad through our international travel programs. Upper school students may apply to our competitive Global Scholar Program (GSP). The GSP includes additional courses and extracurricular requirements, culminating with a capstone project.

Extracurricular Activities

Bolles offers over 85 student-run clubs, numerous school organizations, athletics and fine and performing arts opportunities. Students can explore their creativity through chorus, dance, band, visual arts and theatre. Our internationally recognized athletic program emphasizes the importance of good sportsmanship and the power of play – children developing not just academically, but also physically, socially and emotionally. Our athletic motto is “Humble in victory, gracious in defeat.” With our rotating schedule, students have dedicated time for club meetings during Activities Period held from 10:35-11:25 a.m. every day of the school week except Wednesday.

Curriculum

Students must earn 22 credits to meet graduation requirements. Bolles operates on a two-semester academic year with a six-week summer session. Each semester is 18 weeks, with a nine-week reporting period. Classes are typically limited to 20–22 students. All courses are taught at a college preparatory level. Our expansive curriculum includes five world languages, 44 Honors courses, and 32 AP Courses. Course levels are marked on the transcript by “R” (Regular), “H” (Honors), “AP” (Advanced Placement) and “U” (University Weight). Students must be recommended for Honors, AP and University Weight courses. Bolles offers additional courses through Global Online Academy (GOA).
