The Community

The City of Chandler is located in the southeastern part of Maricopa County, approximately 20 miles from Phoenix. One of the fastest growing communities in the nation, the population of Chandler is currently over 250,000. The economic base in Chandler is diversified. Chandler has a strong economic base including manufacturing, electronics, financial institutions and biosciences. Major companies such as Intel, Northrop Grumman, Wells Fargo Corporate Headquarters, Microchip, and Charles Schwab maintain facilities in Chandler. The population is young and well educated with 75% of adults having some college education.

Chandler High School, established in 1914, with three in its first graduating class, is a four-year (grades 9-12) comprehensive high school located in the heart of downtown Chandler. Chandler High was the first in Arizona to offer the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program and our graduates are recognized and recruited at leading universities across the country. International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement Programs

Chandler High School Honors Programs are structured around the rigorous International Baccalaureate (IB) Program and the Advanced Placement (AP) curriculum. CHS is one of only three schools in the state of Arizona with a full four-year IB program: the Middle Years Program (MYP) is for 9th and 10th grade students in at least one honors class, and the Diploma Program (DP) is for 11th and 12th grade students that complete honors level work in the six core areas of English, World Language, Math, Science, History and Fine Arts. IB students are well-rounded in academics, service to the community and activities such as clubs and sports. The students at CHS also have the option to earn college credit through the AP courses which overlap with the IB courses. Additional AP courses are offered in U.S. History, Human Geography, Comparative Government, Environmental Science and Music Theory. Our IB and AP teachers are well-trained and ready to help the students face the challenges of these rigorous college-level courses.

Dual Enrollment

Dual Enrollment provides students an opportunity to take classes that they will not need to repeat when in college. Classes are offered through Chandler Gilbert Community College and they have transfer partnerships with all of the instate universities. Dual Enrollment may be accepted at out of state public schools as transfer credit as well.
