The June Shelton School was founded on April 2, 1976, by June Shelton and Lawrence and Suzanne Beeman at the request of and with the help of a group of parents of language-learning different students.

Shelton School is a private, state-chartered, nonprofit, nondenominational day school for children with specific language-learning differences. Shelton is the largest school worldwide serving intelligent students who have a learning difference.

Learning differences include Dyslexia, Dysgraphia, Math Disorder, Written Language Disorder, Attention Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder and Speech and Oral Language Disorders.

Approximately 1,069 students attend Shelton, grades Pre-K through 12th. 340 students in the Upper School, with 81 in the class of 2026.

Ranking and GPA

Shelton reports class rank only for seniors in the top 10% of their class. GPA is cumulative and calculated on a 100-point weighted scale, with a passing mark of 70%.

Students earn an additional five quality points for each Honors and/or Dual Credit course. These points are added to semester grades for GPA Calculations but are not reflected in the raw semester grades shown on transcripts.

For Modified courses, five points are subtracted from the semester grade.

Advanced Placement courses are not offered at Shelton School.

Graduation Requirements

The school day consists of 8 periods, approximately 45 minutes long. Students are expected to graduate on the recommended plan.

- 2 credits World Languages
- 1 credit Fine Arts
- 1 credit Technology
- 1 credit P.E.
- .5 credit Health
- .5 credit Speech
- 1.5 credits Ethics, Sociology and Psychology
- 2.5 credits Electives

Students who are unable to meet the requirements of the recommended plan will graduate on the minimum plan.
