SAINT JOSEPH REGIONAL HIGH SCHOOL

Saint Joseph Regional High School, operated under the auspices of the Archdiocese of Newark, is a college preparatory school for young men founded in the Xaverian tradition of Catholic education. The school is located in suburban Montvale in Bergen County, in close proximity to New York City.

Saint Joseph Regional High School currently serves a population of approximately 500 young men in grades 9-12 and is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools.

Admission to Saint Joseph is based upon the HSPT entrance examination given by the Archdiocese of Newark, the student's grade reports, standardized tests, and a recommendation from his previous school.

The school administration and faculty support and encourage student participation in a variety of sports, social, service, and academic activities. There are 13 sports, which include the freshman, junior varsity, and varsity levels, as well as a wide variety of co-curricular activities.

Saint Joseph Regional is an academic community where students develop a sense of self-worth and accomplishment through recognition of each individual's abilities. The school provides its students with a college preparatory program, an emphasis on disciplined work habits, and a commitment to lifelong learning.

Additionally, the school fosters strong parental communication through the integration of several online programs, including Naviance (to assist families in assembling and managing information regarding the college admissions process), Google Classroom (to allow parents to monitor student assignments) and the Genesis Parental Access Support System (which allows students and parents to access academic progress in all subject areas on an ongoing basis throughout the year).

INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

St. Joseph Regional High School offers upperclassmen the opportunity to participate in a 60-hour internship program to provide a meaningful job shadowing experience along with exploring a career area of interest.

CURRICULUM/GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

St. Joseph Regional offers a college preparatory curriculum that requires:

English, Social Studies, Math, Theology	4 years
Laboratory Science	3 years
World Language, Physical Education	2 years

Each student must maintain an average of 7 subjects each academic year. Additionally, St. Joseph Regional partners with the Educere Consortium to provide distance learning opportunities. This program allows students to take online courses in approved subject areas that the school would not otherwise be able to offer because of class size or specialization.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

Advanced Placement Programs are available to those students who are both interested in and qualified to pursue such studies in Biology, US History, World History, Government and Politics, World Language, Chemistry, Computer Science, English Lang & Lit, Psychology, Calculus, Economics, and more.

In addition, 12 academic courses are offered through Seton Hall Project Excel for college credit/dual enrollment.

CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAM

St. Joseph Regional High School offers over 50 award-winning extra/co-curricular activities and clubs. Our top ranked athletic program has 13 interscholastic sports at the freshman, junior varsity, and varsity levels. St. Joe's promotes sportsmanship, teamwork, and life skills through our strong education, nationally recognized performing arts, and championship winning interscholastic sports.

CAMPUS MINISTRY

St. Joseph Regional High School offers a varied program of religious activities for both students and parents. While values taught in theology classes affect the attitudes of both students and staff, St. Joseph incorporates monthly social outreach programs, ongoing charity drives and retreats that foster total personal and spiritual growth. Many of the students volunteer beyond their recommended 10 hours of service to participate in a number of charitable and service activities within the community.
