Must complete 15 "A-G" courses by the end of the Senior Year; Must complete 11 "A-G" courses by the end of 11th grade for UC

Six Ways to Measure College & Career Readiness

WHICH MEASURE DO YOU MEET?

MEASURE A

Career technical Education (CTE):

Pathway completion with a C- or better in the Capstone Course

Plus one of the following criteria:

SBAC: At least a Level 3
"Standard Met" on ELA or
Mathematics and at least a Level
2 "Standard Nearly Met" in the
other subject area

OR

College Credit Courses: One semester with grade of C- or better (Academic/CTE Subjects)

MEASURE B

SBAC: At least a Level 3 "Standard Met" **on both** ELA and Mathematics on Smarter Balance Summative Assessments

MEASURE C

College Credit Courses: Completion of two semesters with a grade of C-

or better (Academic and/or CTE subjects)

MEASURE D

AP: A score of 3 on two Advanced Placement (AP) exams



MEASURE E

A to G: Completion of courses that meet the University of California (UC) or California State University (CSU) A-G criteria with a grade of C- or better

Plus one of the following criteria:

SBAC: At least a Level 3 "Standards Met" on ELA or Mathematics and at least a Level 2 "Standards Nearly Met" in the other subjects

College Credit Course: One semester of college course work with a passing grade of C- or better (Academic/ CTE subjects)

OR

OR

CTE: CTE Pathway completion

OR

AP: A score of 3 or higher on one test AP exam

MEASURE F

State Seal of Bi-literacy (SSB): Receive the State Seal of Bi-Literacy and score at least a Level 3 "Standard Met" or higher in ELA on the Smarter



Every Senior must complete the 2026-2027 FAFSA!

- Please, bring (or have a picture of) your Social Security card with you when attending FAFSA workshops.
 - You need the exact spelling(legal name) and number for the FAFSA.
 - If your parents or you do NOT have a social security number, you <u>BOTH</u> will still need to create a FSA ID and California Dream Act Account

- 1. Create a FAFSA
 - a. Website to create FAFSA account
- 2. FAFSA Application opens OCTOBER 1ST, 2025. Here is the worksheet you can give your parents so that they prepare the documents for the application.

<u>Academic History</u>	Activities & Extracurriculars	<u>Personal Insight</u>
 Where we enter the courses and grades from all schools attended while in high school. Did you take high school-level math or language other than English in middle school (7th-8th grades), you will report those courses and grades in this section. Make sure you refer to your transcripts (or academic records) as you fill out any information. 	 This is the opportunity to tell us about what you're most proud of outside the classroom. Schools are looking for quality, not quantity (make sure to focus on the activities and awards) 	 What do you want us to know about you? These personal insight questions allow you to tell us. You could write about: Your creative side Your thoughts on leadership. A challenge you've faced. Any questions you answer, make sure you show us your personality—like you would in real life.

NCAA Requirements	NAIA Eligibility
English - 4 years	Meet 2 of 3 criteria
Math - 3 years	Graduate in the top half of their graduating class.
Natural/Physical Science – 2 years	Achieve minimum overall high school gpa of 2.0
Additional: English, Math, or Science – 1 year	
Social Science – 2 years	
4 Years Additional Courses – above areas or foreign Language
