School and Community

Heritage High School is located in Brentwood, California, about fifty miles east of San Francisco. Heritage High School, the third comprehensive high school in the Liberty Union High School District, opened on August 1, 2005. Brentwood's population is around 70,000. Once considered a rural town, Brentwood has become a suburban city while still maintaining its agricultural roots. It is one of three comprehensive high schools in the Liberty Union School District.

The school follows a traditional block schedule, with students attending four classes each day on an A/B rotation, for a total of eight classes.

Grading System

The school follows a semester grading period dividing the year into two semesters. Grade points are given as follows.

Graduation Requirements

Students must earn a total of 270 credits to graduate. Each class awards 5 credits per semester when a passing grade is achieved.

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
Advanced Placement Enrollment and Courses


HHS Graduation and College Readiness Metrics (Class of 2025)
