STUDENT ACTIVITIES

Roseville High School students may contribute to student literary productions such as the school newspaper and yearbook, be active in student government groups, participate in a variety of club activities, as well as participate in band and dance productions. Volunteering time to community work is strongly encouraged. Opportunities are available to participate in a wide range of inter-scholastic sports.

THE SCHOOL

Roseville High School, a public school located 15 miles north of Sacramento, serves students in grades 9-12. The school was founded in 1912 as the first school in the Roseville Joint Union High School District. Roseville High School was honored by the California Department of Education with the 2017 California Gold Ribbon School Award. Roseville High School received a full six-year accreditation in 2022 from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). During the 2023-2024 school year, Roseville High School revalidated as an AVID National Demonstration Site. Roseville High School is on a four-by-four block schedule which allows students to explore more electives over their four years.

ENROLLMENT

The student population is approximately 1433 students with a senior class of 363. The racial/ethnic composition consists of: 45.85% Caucasian, 0.77% American Indian or Alaskan, 8.16% Asian, 2.79% Filipino, 3.56% African-American, 1.12% Pacific Islander, and 30.91% identify as Hispanic or Latino. 6.84% identify with two or more races.
