A Word From the Principal, continued...

Below are a few general yearly logistical items for your review.

Grades in Campus Portal

All grading information is available to families online through Campus Portal. You can go directly to Campus Portal from our Quick Links on the Deer Creek webpage. Gradebooks are updated each week, so this is a great tool for staying informed of your student's progress throughout the year. Trimester report cards are also posted to Campus, so you have access to those records as soon as they are finalized each term.

Distribution of Materials around the School

From time to time, individuals or groups not affiliated with the school ask to distribute materials or items to students. Generally speaking, if a non-profit or community organization or group is providing an opportunity for our students, the school will make flyers available to students and may include information in our newsletter.

There are some groups, however, that wish to personally distribute items to students. We do not allow distribution of flyers, materials, food, or fundraising materials on the school grounds that are not directly approved by the school. However, while we may prohibit the distribution on school grounds, the sidewalks along Columbine Drive are not school property and are public walkways. As such, we cannot prevent groups or individuals from lawful distribution. Some examples that have confronted schools in the area include the distribution of donuts by a local youth group, fundraising for other schools, passing out religious materials, or flyers for an after-school for-profit program.

Because we cannot prevent the distribution of materials on the public walkways, I encourage you to talk frankly with your student(s) about not accepting materials from strangers around the school grounds or as they walk to and from school. Students are under no obligation to accept anything offered to them.

As always, we will continue to supervise the school area before and after school to ensure student safety, and we will monitor any distribution of materials to make sure they are compliant with the law.

Community Survey

This survey is an ongoing tool used to gather actionable feedback from our community. Its primary intent is to provide Deer Creek Middle School leaders with a comprehensive understanding of the school environment, culture, and social-emotional well-being of our community. This data is then used to make informed decisions that improve student outcomes and foster a more positive learning environment. **We ask that the survey be completed monthly which will provide us with consistent up-to-date actionable data.** Thank you for taking the time to complete the survey.



District AI tool for students

The following information was shared in the 8/21 [Update for our Community email from Jeffco Public Schools](#):

Jeffco has taken a significant step forward in our commitment to providing innovative and powerful learning tools for students with [Google Gemini](#), a generative AI tool — now active for all students in grades 6-12. Stay informed and confident about this next step with resources on our [Artificial Intelligence webpage](#).

Gemini is available for students to use. However students must still follow the [Deer Creek AI policy](#):

For Artificial Intelligence, students must receive prior teacher approval to use AI on any assignment. Every assignment is subject to a verbal follow-up review to support assessment measures of a student's learning.

Library Books:

The library is open and available for book check out. Books are checked out for 3 weeks at a time. There are no overdue book fines in Jeffco. However, a fine will be placed on your student's account for any books that are lost or damaged beyond repair.

We have been increasing our library collection to reflect the diverse population at our school. Please take a moment to read [this letter](#) regarding our library collection.

Tech Checks

All student Chromebooks will be reviewed monthly for physical damage.

- In the event your student's Chromebook needs a repair, your student will receive a Repair Loaner Chromebook. The device will be sent out for repair. It will be returned to your student when it is returned to the school.
- Students with a damaged Chromebook (screen falling out, broken screen, missing keys) will need to fill out a Reflection Form. They may also have a fine applied to their account. See our [Deer Creek Technology Agreement](#) for more information

From the Dean

Students are settling into the routines of school quite well this year and we appreciate your support with setting them up for success each morning. If there is something we can help with, please reach out to teachers, counselors or other staff in support of your student. We are looking forward to a productive and fun school year.

Thank you for your cooperation and patience with drop off and pick up at school! By the looks of it, many have adjusted to avoid long lines and traffic jams, and we appreciate your help. **PLEASE use the crosswalk on Columbine Drive to cross the street!** It is not safe to cross in other areas and puts students at risk. Support the DCMS staff with safety by following this expectation, both student and adult.

Students watched a presentation covering information from the Jeffco Student and Parent Handbook and the DCMS Student Handbook (Prevention & Intervention Manual). The presentation included highlights of each handbook, not the full content. Both documents can be found on the DCMS website under the Students tab. It is important for students and families to read through each document to understand the expectations, responsibilities and policies of the school and district. Each student took home an acknowledgement form to be signed and returned to their teacher. Please support your student and the school by reinforcing the policies and expectations for a safe and supportive learning environment.

Some additional reminders are provided below.

Student IDs

Students need their student ID every day at school, especially at lunch. Students who regularly come to lunch without their ID will be asked to contact a parent/guardian. Students may purchase another ID at school for \$5 but it may be another week or two before we have that ability. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

Attendance and Tardiness

Students should be in class and ready to learn by 8:50am. The doors open at 8:40 so having your student at the school at or before that time will ensure they will be on time for learning. Being late affects not only your student, but the teacher and the class. For a tardy to be excused, it must be called into the attendance line. A pattern of tardiness will result in consequences at school, so please help your student get to school on time. Being in school consistently offers students the best opportunity for learning and academic and social/emotional growth. Read the attendance and tardy policies in the DCMS Student Handbook (Prevention & Intervention Manual) for more information.

Phones

Deer Creek is a phone-free zone during our school day, and students should have their phones stored in their lockers during classes and at lunch/recess. Read through the phone policy in the Student Handbook (Prevention & Intervention Manual). We appreciate your support with keeping the focus on learning and reminding your students to keep their phones in their locker. If your student needs to be in contact with you, they can call from the office if necessary. If you need to be in touch with your student, please call the office and we can pass along messages.
