Proposition 28— Arts and Music in Schools Funding and Plan Proposal

Purpose: All funds must be used to supplement funding for arts education programs, as specified in EC 8821(e).

YCCPCS Allocation: \$88,258.95 (see reverse side for proposal)

Resource Code: 6770

Requirements: EC Section 8820(f) makes allocated funds available for use for up to three fiscal years. Annual requirements include developing an expenditure plan and submitting a board-approved annual report through the CDE AMS portal. This portal also requires an annual certification that funds will be used to supplement art education and that no more than 1% will be expended on administrative costs, including indirect costs.

Mandated information for this report includes the number of full-time equivalent teachers, classified personnel, and teaching aides, as well as the number of pupils served. Additionally, LEAs must report the number of school sites providing arts education programs with AMS funds. The approved report must be posted to the LEA's website. By October 1, at the end of the third year, the amount of unexpended funds shall be reported to the CDE as a final expenditure report. The CDE will collect unexpended funds for reallocation to all LEAs in the following fiscal year.

Use of Funds: School administrators and educational partners should collaborate to make well-informed decisions that best support students in their local school community. Permissible expenses include, but are not limited to, instruction and training, supplies, materials, and arts education partnership programs for teaching dance, media arts, music, theatre, and visual arts such as folk art, painting, sculpture, photography, craft arts, and creative expression—including graphic arts and design, computer coding, animation, music composition, ensembles, script writing, costume design, film, and video. Additional restrictions on fund usage apply when an LEA's enrollment reaches or exceeds 500 students. However, YCCPCS does not meet or exceed this threshold.

Plan: YCCPCS requests that the governing board review and discuss this plan as an informational item, providing any input on the expenditure of funds received at a regularly scheduled public meeting.
