CURRICULUM

RHS offers a wide variety of courses in order to challenge each student to achieve their potential. Over 230 courses are offered, some at different ability levels. Courses are offered on a semester basis (two semesters a year). Classes are XX minutes in length, 6 periods in a day, 170 student days per year. Students receive one credit per semester for each course successfully completed (proctors receive .5 credit). No credit is awarded for Advisory.
