From the Principal...

Working together as a team with our staff and parents, I am committed to helping each student achieve their very best. Every student is valued and worthy of our best effort.

Student Drop Off Procedures:

Student drop off will start at 7:40 a.m., the assigned entrances are below per grade level (please see attached maps for more detail and for the highlighted location of each entrance).

4K Felker Ave and Door/Entrance 1 K/1/2 Felker Ave and Door/Entrance 4 3rd and 4th 17th St and Door/Entrance 6 5th and 6th 17th St and Door/Entrance 5

There will be no access to the school entryway before 7:40 as in previous years because the outer entrance door will remain locked until 7:40 a.m. Please do <u>not</u> drop off your students before 7:40 a.m. When the entry doors open at 7:40, the students will enter the building and go straight to their classrooms.

Student Pick Up Procedures:

Bus students will board the bus at 2:45.

Student pick up will start at 2:50, the entrances and pick up locations will be the same as the ones above for drop off.

Each grade level will exit at their assigned grade level door (see above for assigned entrances) and an assistant will be at each door. If the parent is not there yet the students will be asked to wait outside on blacktop for their parent. Playing on the playground will **NOT** allowed while they are waiting for their parent.

Breakfast

Breakfast at Lincoln will be available starting at 7:30 AM in the cafeteria. Only students eating breakfast will be allowed in the building at 7:30 AM.

Student Absences

If your child(ren) will be absent or late, please call our school office at 387-1296 before 9:00 AM. Your call is important to ensuring your child's safety and maintaining accurate attendance, lunch, and milk counts. If we do not receive a call from home, the absence will be recorded as *unexcused*.

Student Arrival/Tardiness

The school doors open at 7:40 AM and school starts at 7:45 AM. If your child arrives after 8:00 AM he/she will be considered tardy. Tardy arrivals are recorded as unexcused absences.

Student Dismissal

*Students who are walking and riding bikes should go home immediately following dismissal.

Bus students will board the bus at 2:45.

Student pick up will start at 2:50, the entrances and pick up locations will be the same as the ones above for drop off.

Each grade level will exit at their assigned grade level door (see above for assigned entrances) and an assistant will be at each door. If the parent is not there yet the students will be asked to wait outside on blacktop for their parent. Playing on the playground will NOT be allowed while they are waiting for their parent.

Signing your child in/out of school

If a student must leave school before dismissal, parents MUST sign the student out in the office. We would also ask that you sign in your child upon their return. It is our intent to ensure the safest possible environment for your child.

Lunch Application Reminder

Please do not hesitate to apply for the Federally-Funded Free and Reduced Lunch Program if you think you may qualify.

Application and eligibility information is strictly confidential. For questions, please call Mrs. Bargender or stop by the school office for a form.

Parking

Please observe all parking restriction signs on the streets around the school. Marshfield Police frequently patrol the area during drop-off and dismissal times and will issue tickets.

Crossing Guards

There will be Crossing Guards at the corners of Felker Avenue and 17th Street, 17th Street and Palmetto Avenue, and 8th Street and Peach Avenue before and after school.

Bicycles/Scooters

<u>Students are reminded to walk their bikes and carry their scooters</u> when they are on school grounds. Students should lock up their bicycles!

Lincoln School Safety Patrol

The Safety Patrols help to provide a safe school environment for all our children. Parents can help the patrols by reviewing the importance of safety rules with your child(ren).

Students are to cross the street only at the crosswalks. They are told not to cross directly to a car parked across the street from school. Safety Patrol members are available to assist students on street corners adjacent to the school.

If you have any questions regarding Safety Patrol, please call the school office.

Court Orders

Generally, the custodial and non-custodial parents continue to have certain parental rights. Occasionally, the court issues restraining orders against one of the parents in the custody agreement. Frequently the school gets put in the middle and does not know what parental rights the custodial and non-custodial parents possess. Unless we have a copy of a court order that lists specific restraints against the parental rights of the non-custodial parent, the school will assume that both parents continue to possess their basic parental rights.

PBIS – Positive Behavioral Intervention Supports

School Expectations of Marshfield Elementary Students

- I will be RESPECTFUL.
- I will be RESPONSIBLE.
- I will be SAFE.

Why PBIS works?

- Prevents unwanted behaviors
- Teaches new behaviors step-by-step
- Uses data to track behaviors and meet goals
- Proactive not Reactive
- Consistency throughout the school
- Lesson plans that incorporate expected behaviors

What Is PBIS

PBIS stands for Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports.
PBIS gives schools a framework for community-based learning that addresses student behavior. There are understandable practices embedded in the system using a three-tiered support system.

To achieve academic success PBIS integrates three elements to support the outcomes for social behavior success. When students disrupt the class and spend a lot of time out of the classroom they are not learning. Expected behaviors are modeled and taught and students are given time to practice the behaviors with feedback for reinforcement of these skills. Students and teachers will feel less frustrated on how to handle these behaviors and allow students to be successful academically.

The PBIS model recognizes that not all problem behavior is the same, nor do all students respond to the same types of interventions. The PBIS framework guides schools in meeting the need of students at all tiers through a continuum of interventions.
