Madeira High School's Hall of Fame 2025 Class

Madeira High School (MHS) has announced its newest class of inductees for its Athletic Hall of Fame: Kristen Barnhill ('06), Joe Bodnar ('12), John Cardoza ('00), Chris Eberle ('06), and Bonnie Patten ('69).

Barnhill was a standout in both basketball and softball. She was a member of two district championship basketball teams and a key player on the softball team, where her elite hitting and stellar defense helped lead them to multiple league and postseason championships. She was a multi-time first-team All-Cincinnati Hills League selection in both sports.

Bodnar was an outstanding football and baseball player. In football, he earned Second Team All-State honors while leading the team to an undefeated regular season as a senior. A four-year letterman in baseball, he was a three-time All-Cincinnati Hills League honoree, helping the team win two district titles, and a state runner-up finish in 2011.

Cardoza excelled in football, wrestling, and track and field. On the gridiron, he was a two-time All-Cincinnati Hills League selection and was chosen for the East/West All-Star Game. A four-time district qualifier in wrestling, he won a Cincinnati Hills League title as a senior. In track, he was a four-time district champion and finished 6th at the state championship meet.

Eberle had a star-studded career in soccer and basketball. On the soccer field, he was a key part of teams that won four district titles, three Cincinnati Hills League crowns, and back-to-back undefeated state championships in 2002 and 2003. He was a two-time All-Cincinnati Hills League selection in both soccer and basketball. In basketball, he was part of a district championship team and a CHL champion squad, and he was selected to play in the City All-Star Game as a senior.

Patten was a pioneer for women's athletics at Madeira High School, helping to lay the groundwork for the school's 'Amazons' name. She played six varsity sports, including four years each in basketball, field hockey, volleyball, and softball. Her teams were incredibly dominant, with her basketball team losing only one game in four years and her field hockey and volleyball teams going undefeated during her entire high school career.

The induction ceremony will include a dinner and formal introduction of the new inductees on Friday, December 5, at Madeira High School. They will also be recognized at halftime of the Mustangs' home basketball game against Finneytown.

The MHS Athletic Hall of Fame was established by the district's Athletic Boosters in 1990 to recognize athletes, coaches, and contributors who have made a positive impact on the athletic program.
