The Importance of Regular Attendance

Our # 1 Goal at Grant Elementary is for all students to achieve their very BEST! Parents/ Guardians, you play a critical role in achieving this goal. **Starting each day on the right foot is the important first step. To be successful, students must arrive at school on time and be prepared for the day. Learning begins at 7:55 AM every day, so it is vital that students arrive at school no later than 7:50 AM.** If your student participates in the breakfast program, they should arrive at school at 7:35. The school day ends at **2:50 PM**.

If students must miss school due to illness or appointments, **District policy requires that you call the school or send a signed note that excuses your child when s/he is absent.** Please direct these notes and calls to the school office rather than to individual teachers. The number to call to excuse your child is 715-384-4747 and prompt 0 (zero) to leave a message about attendance. Even in the middle of the night, calls to school can be made to school to report that s/he will not be in attendance the next day. If you forget to call or send a note, your child will be counted as unexcused. In cases of absences for medical reasons, please provide the school a statement from a physician so that these days are taken into consideration when calculating the 10 excused absences. Thank you for your cooperation.

As a point of reference, parents & students should make every attempt not to miss more than 2 days of school per quarter. Specifically, as written in Wisconsin Statutes:

“A child cannot be excused for more than 10 days in a school year.”^s 118.15(3)(c)

In addition:

“If a student misses part or all of five (5) or more days without an acceptable excuse in a school semester, the student is “habitually truant.”^s 118.16(1)(a)

We want **every student** to achieve at his or her highest level, and by working together we can make this happen for all of the students at Grant Elementary. Thank you for all that you do to assist the staff members of Grant Elementary in our goal of providing the very best for your child.

The Amazing Benefits of Reading to Your Child

I have so many wonderful memories of my childhood, and believe it or not, several of them revolve around reading. Every Sunday afternoon, my brother, sister, and I would pile onto the couch and Dad would read the comics from the Sunday newspaper to us. We called them “Funnies.” Dad used different voices for each character, and we would giggle and giggle.

Reading to your child can create precious memories for them that they won’t soon forget. But there are even more benefits to reading out loud to your child. According to the Huffington Post (“5 Hidden Benefits of Reading for Kids”), studies show that four-year-olds who are read to three to five times a week are six months ahead of their peers in reading intelligence. Children who are read to daily are a year ahead. These children keep doing better and better academically as they progress through school. Reading to children also improves their vocabulary and gives them richer language skills. Early readers have better self-esteem, confidence, and communication skills. Older students also enjoy a parent or caregiver reading to them. There are excellent novels that will engage your older reader and keep them begging for you to read one more chapter.

It’s important to remember that children often do what they see their parents doing. When kids see their parents picking up a book to read for enjoyment, they are more likely to have the same desire. Make it a deliberate habit to let your child catch you reading.

So whether you’re building fond memories with your child, looking to improve their vocabulary and language skills, or role modeling the joys of reading, carve time out of your schedule as frequently as you can to read to your child.

Food Service Policy: Negative Balances

Below is the negative balance section of the Food Service Policy.

School District personnel will notify families with low or negative balances. Negative/low balance statements will be issued once per week at the junior and senior level and twice per month at the elementary level. For elementary students, no more than three (3) charges will be allowed per student. If the family cannot be contacted by phone, a letter will be sent. After the third charge, elementary students will be served a sandwich and water until the account is paid in full. The appropriate cost for the sandwich will be added to the family account.

Junior and senior students do have the opportunity to pay cash for items from the a la carte line if they have a zero or negative balance in their account. If a student has money to purchase a reduced price or paid meal at the time of meal service, a full meal will be provided. The money will not be used to repay unpaid charges if the student intends to eat that day.

Here are a few tips to make sure your food service account is in good standing.

- If you have received a text or email indicating your balance is low or negative, send payment as soon as possible or make a payment in Skyward Family Access.
- Talk with your middle and high school students to set limits on ala carte spending if needed
