Superintendent Dr. David Gentile



Dr. David Gentile began his career as the Superintendent of the Ewing Public Schools in November of 2022.

Dr. Gentile's mission is to provide every student the opportunity to achieve their dreams through education was forged long before he stepped foot in a classroom. His father, an Italian immigrant, overcame learning challenges to become a self-taught mechanical engineer who, through sheer drive and determination, founded a successful family HVAC business. His mother owned a small hair styling business that operated out of her shop built by his father in the basement of their modest home in a working-class small-town, USA.

The value of education was nurtured throughout his childhood. His parents, who always wanted more for their children, insisted they study hard and receive the best education possible. Dr. Gentile's sister earned a Ph.D. in accounting while he fell in love with teaching and learning. As a teenager, he was a swimming instructor for younger children; it was then that he discovered his passion for teaching. Schoolwork did not always come easy for Dr. Gentile, struggling especially with reading; until, as a freshman in college, a learning consultant ensured he received help to overcome this obstacle. From that point forward, he enjoyed a new world of reading, learning, and helping others become successful learners. He tutored local high school students to help work his way through college and, in doing so, confirmed his love for teaching and learning.

Dr. Gentile's family was not one of great means; however, he had some success on the athletic field which afforded him access to an education. He attributes his personal work ethic to his experience as a student, athlete, and employee. He vividly remembers extremely long days as he worked in the family HVAC business, maintained good grades, and participated in baseball and football.

He started his formal career in education in 1998 with the Millville Public School District as an elementary school teacher and high school baseball and football coach. His own experiences helped him identify with his young students and help them understand themselves better as learners. Dr. Gentile gravitated to instructing students who had learning obstacles, ultimately leading him to teach in an alternative eighth-grade program he helped design for the Runnemede Public School District.

In 2003, he officially started his leadership career as a middle school vice principal and was later promoted to the position, of principal in Runnemede, New Jersey. In 2008, he traveled up the road to become the Superintendent of Schools in the Mount Holly Public School District. Working collaboratively with his team, they achieved many improvements and successes: reducing school violence, improving student achievement, and finding and addressing inequities. He learned how to work effectively with stakeholders throughout the school community, through a collaborative effort to pass a comprehensive bond referendum and oversee multiple capital improvement projects.

In 2010, he was appointed Superintendent of Schools in the Millville Public School District. Dr. Gentile spent the next decade working with staff and community members on a shared vision to create a world-class district. Together, they realized many improvements and successes: student achievement, establishing a professional community dedicated to instructional improvement, creating a system of classroom walkthroughs, and establishing a comprehensive professional development approach. Their professional work was recognized by both McRel and ASCD as they featured the district's efforts in their video series *Classroom Instruction that Works*. He also worked collaboratively in Millville to secure New Jersey Department of Education funding to address crowding and capacity issues, as well as other long-standing educational concerns. As a result, the district received over one-hundred million dollars in additional state funding to complete a comprehensive renovation project that completely overhauled the existing high school campus.

In 2019, Dr. Gentile was appointed Superintendent of Schools in the Voorhees Township School District, where he worked with staff and community members to create a much-needed redistricting plan, to advance full-day kindergarten and the construction of an early childhood center, as well as integrating more technology into classroom instruction. Like school leaders throughout the country, he navigated uncharted territory of the world-wide COVID pandemic. In 2022, he became the Chief Academic Officer of the Cumberland County Technical High School District, where he was responsible for student admissions, equity, curriculum/instruction, and various other special projects for the district.

Dr. Gentile's goal is to work collaboratively with the Ewing community to ensure students receive an exceptional education and are prepared for the world following graduation.

All district programs are evaluated by the New Jersey Department of Education. The District is accredited by the State of New Jersey.

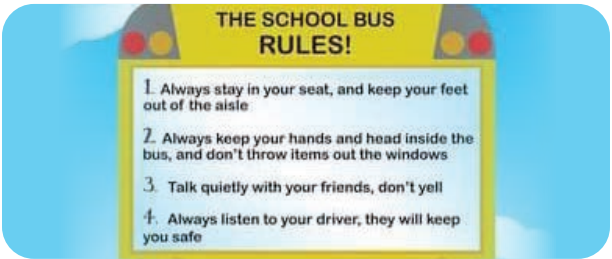
Public Information

All student contact information will be updated DAILY using the Guardian 1 and Guardian 2 contact information located in Genesis Parent Portal. Please make sure to update your phone number or email in Genesis Parent Portal if your contact information changes.

Emergency School Closings

Weather conditions or the loss of utility services (heat, water or electric) can mean a delayed opening, the closing of the schools or an early dismissal. Should there be a delayed opening, all students are to report to school **1 hour and 30 minutes** later than normal. Do not drop your child off at school at the usual time as there may not be sufficient staff for supervision.

The Week of Respect is



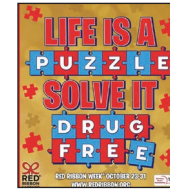
October 6-10, 2025

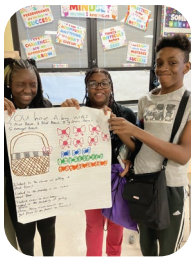

Student Services



The Special Services Department provides a variety of educational and related operations/grants management services to assist students in the learning process. The goal of Special Services is to help students reach their potential as learners and members of the school community.

Health and Medical Services monitor student health through screenings, routine exams and the provision of swift attention to medical problems.

Homebound Instruction is available to students confined at home because of lengthy illness or other special circumstances.

Special Education is provided in self-contained classrooms, resource rooms and inclusive general education classes throughout the district to all eligible students, ages 3-21. Arrangements are made with other school districts to provide special education for children with exceptional needs if a program is unavailable in Ewing.

Related services are also provided and include speech and language therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, counseling and transportation services.

Child Study Teams provide diagnosis and, when necessary, consultation or intervention for students with learning or school-related problems.

Project Child offers comprehensive services for the identification, assessment and treatment of pre-school handicapped infants and children

Developmental Kindergarten (DK) provides additional support and an initial small student - teacher ratios for newly de-classified preschool students and other qualifying kindergartens. The DK classroom is paired with another kindergarten classroom as the school year progresses to prepare students for successful transition into 1st grade. DK classroom is located at Antheil. The Preschool Program serves the needs of



children who require special services ages 3-5. More information about this program can be found by following the District Information/Special Services links on the District Website.

The School Attendance Officer has a dual role of verifying student residency and working with truant students. This may involve home visitations, student counseling and parent consultations. The School Attendance Officer has the legal responsibility to ensure compliance with the Compulsory School Attendance Law.

For information on these services, contact the Director of Special Services X7176.

Supplemental Support Services in language arts, literacy and mathematics are available for Grades K-8. For information about Supplemental Services, contact the building principal. English as a Second Language (ESL) assists students in developing and acquiring English language skills. For information about ESL, contact the ESL Supervisor at X2156.

Testing and Evaluation Services are provided as mandated by state law to assess individual students' needs as well as to evaluate programs and curricula. State mandated assessments include the NJSLA (New Jersey Student Learning Assessment) for students in Grades 3-11 in English Language Arts and Mathematics, and the NJ Science Learning Assessment (SLA) in Grades 5 and 8 in Science.

The district administers the PSAT in October to students in Grades 10-11. Testing related questions may be addressed to the Director of Elementary Education & Assessment at X2121.

ASYSST

The Available School Youth Services Support Team (ASYSST) is a school-based youth services program to help young people navigate the adolescent years, finish their education, obtain skills leading to employment or continuing education, and graduate healthy and drug free. Free And Reduced Price Meals 2025–2026 School Meals and Summer EBT

Students who attended Ewing Township Public Schools in 2024–2025, who were eligible for Free or Reduced Price Meals in June 2025 via a meal app or Snap approved will continue receiving those benefits for the first 30 school days through October 16, 2025 or until a new application is determined. Please note that kindergarteners or other new students will NOT automatically be extended the free or reduced price benefits for their household. Parents/guardians should plan to complete a new application or contact the Food Service Office before the opening of school.

A 2025–2026 application can be keyed in on-line or a paper copy submitted to the Food Service Office on or before Tuesday, September 30th or students who were free/reduced from last school year will be classified as full price for meals beginning Thursday, October 16. Applications may be submitted at any time during the school year, however, free or reduced price benefits do not begin until after the application is determined.

The 2025–2026 application packet is now available! Parents/Guardians may apply on-line by visiting the district website (www.ewing.k12.nj.us) and follow the link to the Food Services tab and simply 'click' on the Free and Reduced Price Meals located on the left of the page to access the link to the 2025–2026 application packet. Your meal status will be determined within 10 days. A fill-to-print application is also available. Additionally, applications are available through the Genesis Parent portal or at any school, guidance office, or Food Service Department. Interested parents/guardians should complete one application for all the children in their household. Completed paper applications should be returned to the Food Service Office at the Gusz Building, 220 Ewingville Road, Ewing, New Jersey, 08638.

Benefits for Foster Children: Be sure to read the instructions on the application. If you submit a current "Resource Family Parent Identification Letter" (DYFS 5-49) to the Food Service Office, it will not be necessary to complete an application for your foster child(ren) for the school year.

Direct Certification Letters are emailed/mailed as processed. If a DC letter is received, it is not necessary to complete a 2025–2026 application; the students listed will automatically receive free meal. If all students in the household are NOT named in the letter(s), a copy of the letter must be returned to the Food Service Office with the missing student's name(s) listed, so they can also receive free meals.

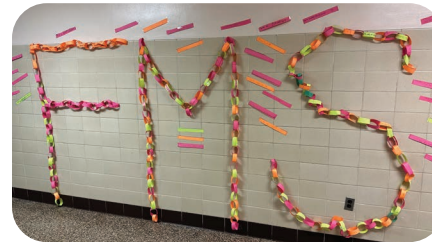
Middle School Information

The Board authorizes the imposition of a fine for the loss, damage, or destruction of a Chromebook, iPad, computer peripherals, or textbook and reserves the right to withhold a report card or diploma from any student whose payment of a fine is in arrears.

- Book so damaged (by water or otherwise) as to be unusable ---> 100% of list price
