 - ❖ Westglades Middle School Summary by Sara Korol.
 - New Program 2023
 - Initiated from Riverglades Elementary Parents
 - 1 core and 1 elective in Spanish
 - Current Social studies/Civics and Spanish for Spanish Speakers is the elective
 - 90 minutes of instruction in Spanish to count as Dual Language
 - 7th grade class has 6 students from program
 - Struggling to attract students
 - Students struggling to keep up in the Spanish for Speakers class
 - 6th grade class has 19 students

- 13 come from Riverglades Dual Language program
- Not enough schools feeding into program.

❖ Eagle Point Elementary Summary by Joy Gomez-Hicks

- Program running for 13 years
- 21 Dual Language classes
- 80% of school population is Hispanic/Latino
- Bonuses given to teachers
 - Principal works in her budget
 - Uses Team Lead Stipend
- K-2
 - 4 team leads
- 3rd – 5th
 - 3 teachers per grade
 - 1 Spanish (SLA and Civics/Social Studies)
 - 1 ELA
 - 1 Math
- JEDI used for interventions
- Regular communication with parents and teachers
- Principal attends conferences around the country
 - Trains teachers on what she has learned
- Fully staffed
- Community engagement
 - Field trips
- Wants/needs more funding
 - Uses and applies for grants annually
- Have their own Dual Language committee
 - Do fundraisers for the program

- Program has a 20 attrition once the student gets to 3rd grade
 - Keeping up with the pace of the program
 - Principal does a Dual Language Kindergarten Roundup to set expectations and still struggles keeping students
 - Going to gifted
 - Leaving school
- Admin obstacles
 - No benchmark tools to see growth in fluency progression in Spanish
 - Would be nice to have an automated assessment
 - Teams?
 - I-ready in Spanish ?
 - Prefer a tool that is already being used
 - Admin not fluent in Spanish
 - Difficult to do Spanish teacher evaluations on the
 - Staffing
 - Difficult to find teachers proficient in English and Spanish
 - Necessary because if class size drops and needs to teach English needs to be able to
 - How do you entice teachers?
 - More compensation
 - Principal goes to job fairs
 - Takes and looks at transfers
 - Creates a bench with teacher assistants
 - That has been successful and has Spanish teachers that started as teacher assistants
- 25% of the School is a Choice
 - Dual Language makes up 80% of the Choice seats
 - Program brings in active parents from all over
 - PTA President drives from Deerfield Beach
 - Last year 5th grade class graduates went to 9 different schools

- Where do the students go after elementary?
 - Magnet School be a good option?
 - Pair up with Middle Schools with not a lot of feeder schools
 - Example: Westglades take a few of the ERE kids
 - Program Structure
 - K – 2nd
 - 1 Teacher for English and 1 Teacher for Spanish
 - Taught: 50% Spanish and 50% English
 - 3rd
 - 1 Teacher for English and Spanish
 - Taught: 70% in Spanish and 30% in English
 - 4th
 - 1 Teacher for English and Spanish
 - Taught: 60% in Spanish and 40% in English
 - 5th
 - 1 Teacher for English and Spanish
 - Taught: 50% in Spanish and 50% in English
 - Website
 - Need more clarity that the school offered Dual Language
 - Dual Language students are High Achiever and test well
 - Classroom visits
 - Saw both self contain and dual teacher classes
 - Visits successful
 - Lots of boards and reinforcement outside and around the classroom
 - Parent Concerns
 - Principal has coffee and conversations
 - 30 plus parents attended
 - Successful
 - Setup individual meetings with parents as well

❖ A-Z Kids | RAZ Plus Espanol Rep Sandy Reyes

- RAZ online literacy component
 - Can select reading level
 - Parent login
 - Log into clever and access A-Z reading
 - Top right can create parent login
 - Can request access to teacher
 - Can request monthly reports automatically
- Program created for Dual Language classrooms
 - Can listen, read and answer questions from e-book
 - Teacher can adjust material to their Spanish level (use to default to their English level)
 - Can mark books and take notes online
 - Student can record themselves reading
- Building teacher landing page to better understand program
- AI for grading
 - Speech recognition available for English, ask was to do it in Spanish
 - Could be useful for teachers to monitor growth
