Your early investment through the Foundation provided the essential seed funding needed to purchase professional-grade equipment and helped bring a long-held dream to life. This landmark represents a bold step forward in arts education and reflects the growing demand for creative talent in South Carolina and beyond.

Film students will spend two years immersed in the craft of filmmaking, culminating in the production of a major original film, a transformative experience made possible by your investment. When they graduate, they will carry with them the skills, experience, and confidence to pursue their dreams in the growing film industry. As the Film department grows, so does its power to transform the creative economy of our state and open new doors for South Carolina's young artists.

### PRE-PRODUCTION

Because of you, the Film Department hosted Guest Artist, Dan Philipp, an experienced gaffer from Atlanta, who brought his 3-ton grip truck to campus for a hands-on demo of the dolly and other professional equipment.

**Next on the Film department's wish list:** A professional dolly and a Steadicam, so that students can have access to them year-round.

### QUIET ON SET!

In fall 2024, eleven juniors walked into their first Film classes as trailblazers. These students didn't just join a new department, they became part of the next generation of filmmakers, producers, and storytellers. Led by South Carolina native Kevin Human, a seasoned filmmaker with a career in Los Angeles, they began studying the language of film from the inside out.

### ACTION!

The Film department quickly became a vibrant, collaborative space, blending seamlessly with the school's other disciplines. Creative writers, actors, visual artists, and musicians worked alongside film students to bring original stories to life.



### THE PREMIERE

In May, the lights went down in the Sakas Theater for the first-ever Film Exhibition and Student Showcase. Donors were invited to experience this remarkable moment firsthand. The exhibition featured original works by Junior Film and Senior Animation students and included a live performance and Q&A that highlighted the depth of talent and collaboration across departments. It was a powerful experience, not just for the young artists who presented their work, but for the entire Governor's School community.

# A MILESTONE EVENT

On April 26, 2025, the South Carolina Governor's School for the Arts and Humanities celebrated 25 years of transformative arts education at its milestone Anniversary Gala at the historic Westin Poinsett in Greenville.

With over 225 arts advocates attending, the event raised over \$250,000 to support **THRIVE25**, the Governor's School Foundation's initiative to expand access and eliminate financial barriers for young artists.

## Removing Barriers Access & Affordability

One of the most important parts of our mission at the Foundation is to remove barriers so talented young artists can attend the Governor's School, participate fully, and confidently pursue their dreams. Tuition, room, and board are covered, but many students still face financial hurdles that can keep them from fully embracing this life-changing opportunity. For example, the \$3,900 meal plan fee in the 2024-2025 school year was out of reach for many families, but **thanks to your generosity**, we can ensure no student has to turn down their place due to financial hardship.

### This year, your gifts supported:

- Meal plans for **1 in 3** high school and **1 in 4** summer students.
- Travel, hotel, and flights for four drama students to attend college auditions in Chicago.
- Headshots for students who couldn't afford them.
- Sheet music for music students who needed it.
